*The Trunk Road (Brynmawr and Clydach, Gwent)
(Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1979*

Notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State for Wales has made an Order under section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended, which shall come into operation on 29th June 1979. The effect of the Order will be to prohibit the waiting of any vehicle at any time in the lengths of road specified in the Schedule to this notice.

Exceptions in the Order will permit waiting for the following purposes:

- (a) building, industrial or demolition operation; and
- (b) carrying out essential services connected with the maintenance of the road and the supply of gas, water and electricity.

A copy of the Order together with a plan may be seen during normal office hours at the offices of the Divisional Surveyor (Northern Division), Gwent County Council, Llanfoist during a period of 6 weeks from 14th June 1979.

Copies of the Order may be obtained, free of charge, on application to the Secretary of State, Welsh Office, Transport and Highways Group, Government Buildings, Ty Glas Road, Llanishen, Cardiff CF4 5PL, quoting the reference WR15/3/90.

If you wish to question the validity of the Order or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, or that any requirement of that Act or of any instrument made under it, has not been complied with in relation to the Order, you may, within the aforesaid period of 6 weeks apply to the High Court for the suspension or quashing of the Order or of any provision contained therein.

SCHEDULE

Lengths of the Neath-Abergavenny Trunk Road (A465) (hereinafter referred to as the trunk road) in the county of Gwent:

1. That length of the trunk road designed as an escape road for vehicles which is situated on the northern side of the trunk road approximately 1,000 metres south-west of the junction of the trunk road with Main Road at Sale Yard and which extends from its junction with the main carriage-way of the trunk road in an easterly direction for a distance of 32 metres.
