*The South Northamptonshire District Council (Parish of Weston and Weedon—Footpaths SD 3 and SD 5) Public Path Diversion Order 1979.*

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order (hereinafter referred to as "the Order") made on 20th June 1979, is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation or to be confirmed by the South Northamptonshire District Council as an unopposed Order.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modification, will be to divert:

- (i) the public right of way being part of footpath SD 3 at Lois Weedon Farm, Lois Weedon, from a point at grid reference SP 5974 4788 adjoining the Weston—Plumpton county road at its junction with footpath SD 34 and running in a south-south-easterly direction for a distance of 815 metres to a point at grid reference SP 6004 4710 at Kettle End to a line running from the said point at grid reference SP 6004 4710 in a northerly and then north-easterly direction for a distance of 540 metres to a point at grid reference SP 6013 4764 adjoining public footpath SD 34; and
- (ii) the public right of way being part of footpath SD 5 at Lois Weedon Farm, Lois Weedon, from a point at grid reference SP 5955 4761 adjoining the Weston—Plumpton county road and running in an easterly direction for a distance of 550 metres to a point at grid reference SP 6013 4764 adjoining public footpath SD 34 to a line running from the said point at grid reference SP 5955 4761 and running in a southerly direction for a distance of 80 metres to a point at grid reference SP 5953 4752 adjoining the Weston—Plumpton county road and then in an east-south-easterly direction for a distance of 530 metres to a point at grid reference SP 6007 4745 adjoining public footpath SD 34.
