NOTICE OF SEIZURE UNDER THE CUSTOMS AND EXCISE MANAGEMENT ACT 1979

To: B. WEIDINGER (address unknown)

Pursuant to Section 139(6) of the Customs and Excise Management Act 1979, and paragraph 1 of the 3rd Schedule thereto, the Commissioners of Customs and Excise hereby give you notice that by virtue of the powers contained in the customs and excise Acts and any enactments amending those Acts, certain goods, namely 1 Gas Pistol and 5 Cartridges (detained from B. Weidinger on 18th August 1978 at Southampton) have been seized as liable to forfeiture upon the grounds that:- The said goods were imported into the United Kingdom on 18th August 1978 contrary to the prohibition for the time being in force imposed by the Import of Goods (Control) Order 1954, made under the Import, Export and Customs Powers (Defence) Act 1939 section 1.

Whereby and by force of Section 3(1) of the Import, Export and Customs Powers (Defence) Act 1939 and Section 44(b) of the Customs and Excise Act 1952 the said goods are liable to forfeiture.

If you claim that the said goods are not liable to forfeiture you must within one month from the date of this notice of seizure give notice of your claim in accordance with the said Schedule to the said Act. In default of such notice the said goods will be deemed to have been duly condemned as forfeited and will be liable to be disposed of in such manner as the Commissioners of Customs and Excise may direct. If you make such claim within the time aforesaid, legal proceedings will be taken for the condemnation thereof.—Dated 9th July 1979.
