## London, June 19.

His day Dr. Creighton, Bishop of Bath and Wells was folemnly confectated at Lambeth with the usual Ceremonies, at which affifted the Bilhop of London in the place of his Grace the Arch-biftiop of Canterbury, not yet fully recovered from his late diftemper, with the Bifhops of Winchefter and Ely, where an excellent Sermon was preached on the occasion, by Dr. Hill, Chaplain to his Grace the Duke of Ormond ; after which, the Bifhops, feveral of the Nobility, and many perfons of Quality were entertained at a plentiful dinner.

Legorn, Fune 9. The 4th inftant arrived here the Dutch Convoy of two men of war and five Merchant thips, and the fame day the Olive bransh richly laden from Smirua, leaving behind several Holland thips, one E glith thip, and one French thip, lading for feveral parts of Christendom. They write from Smirna, that the Vifier intending fuddenly to leave Candia had fince Febru-ary last leid on Embargo upon all vestels, which he had preffed to attend him.

This week arrived allo the Owen and David, and five other English ships from Puglis laden with Oyls and bound for England, and may in 8 or 10 days depart hence under Convoy of the Jerfey and Centur ion Fregats. The Dutch Convoy may follow in 15 days for Holland.

The Lady of Loretto, a French thip arriving in 25 days from Alexandria, came thence in company with two thips of Meffina homewards bound, one Polach, and one Bark for Marseilles, from whole company the was leparated about 11 days before her arrival here. She left in the Port of Alexandoia the Conception lading for this place with Several other thips bound for Candia, Marfeilles, Venice, Majorca, and fix Turks bound for Barbary. Three days before her departure failed thence eight Ships and two Saichs bound for Conftantinople, and the 26th paft, on her return hither off Fauigliana the met with Seven Maltha Gallies, and the next day with the Great Dukes squadron, which had not then met with any confiderable adventure-

Genoua, June 11. Here is lately put in here 2 Bark, having on board - 5 Italian flaves, which about three months before ma le there escape from Argier, and have fince been wandring up and down the fea with various fortune.

Here are lately arrived three French ships from Lisbon laden with Sugar and Tobacco, and two Datch men of war from the Levant homewards bound ; here are also in Port the Return and the Conclusion, both of them English ships bound for Zant.

The Duke of this Republick has been lately much indifpoled, but is now upon recovery.

The 9th inftant according to cuftom, election was made by Lots of three Senators, viz. Gio Baptista Zaogli, Carlo Pallavicino, and Gio Giacomo Monja, who are to fucceed as Governours, and of two others, viz. Marco Antonio Saoli, and Hieronimo Rodino to be Frocurators of this Republick.

Our Convoy is fafely arrived at Cadin, where the Gallions are fuldenly expected.

From Milan they tell us, that the Duke d' Offuna the new Governour continues to receive the Vifits and Compliments of all perfons of the most eminent quality. He very intent upon the advance of the publick interest, endeavouring to ingratiate himfelf with the people by cafing them from their payments ; he has fince his entry upon the Goverment confirmed all the Orders and Edias of the Governours his Predeceffors, especially those in which the ftate of the Church was any ways concerned.

The 25th pair being the Dukes birth-day, the Officers of the Army, Ministers of State, and publick Officers appeared at the Court richly habited to con pliment their Governour, as did also the Nobility and Ladies.

From Jurin we are rold, that the Duke of Savoy was gone to divert himfelf for fome time at Venaria and Kive-Ii, and that he had named Segnior Bigliere for his Amballador Extraordinary to the Court of Rome, for which he was making preparation.

Danizig, June 11. The 6th infant arrived here she Bishop of Gulme the Vice-Chancellor of Peland, and with the usual tolemnity received the Homage and Oath of Fidelity from this City, as he had cone the 4th inftant from the Magifirates of the City of Thorens he was Treated and entertained here with much civility upon the publick account, this people giving many reftimontes of their fatisfaction, and proclaiming it with the notic of their Ca-non. The Vice Chancellor intended to be at Warfare the 16th inftant, and accordingly went hence to Elbing. where he is allo to take the Homage of that place. The Provincial Dier of Pruffia is broken up withour any refolution, leveral of the principal perfons who should have been concerned in the Assembly being abfent to that they expect the Kings Letters to empowre them to meet again.

Many of the other fmaller Affemblies in the feveral Provinces and Palatinates have concluded it necessary to fummon the Arriereban or publick Attembly in the neld in Arms, protefting withmuch zeal against the French faction, and against such perfons as have combined against the prefent Government ; wherereupon his Majefty has thought fit to dispatch his Circulatory and Universal Letters to all the Noblefs, to acquaint them with the sente of the Dietines, and the neceffity which obliges him to fummon them to this publick Affembly for the prefervation of the publick peace and fafety of the Kingdom; giving th m account alfo of the prefent ftate of affairs, and particularly, that the Baffa of Siliftria had leiled at Bialogrof a perion of Karnewsky, his Envoy to the Cham of Tartary, that he was not affured of the intention of the Coffacks they having not yet fent thei Deputies to Treat; that there was an eminent necessity of paying and recruiting the Army 3 that the posture of the Turks, Tartars, and others of their neighbors made it necessary to enter into some strict alliance with fome potent Princes their neighbors; nor was the danger threatned from within the bowels of the kingdom to be despiled; many Letters in Cypher being lately intercepted, written by fev ral perfons ill affected : His Majefty defiring that these Letters might take place as a double fummons, and that they would prepare to feet in a warlike pofture at fuch a place of Rendezvous as should in little time be appointed them by their 3d and last fummons, where he promifed to be perfonally prefent and ready to hazard his life for the good of his Countrey.
