ROAD TRAFFIC ACTS

BEDFORDSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL

Notice is hereby given that on 25th September 1979, the County Council of Bedfordshire made an Order under sections 72 (3) and 73 (1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967 as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968 and Schedule 19 to the Local Government Act 1972 and Schedule 6 to the Road Traffic Act 1974.

The effect of the Order as from 8th October 1979, will be to prohibit the driving of any vehicle at a speed exceeding 30 miles per hour on the following lengths of road in Belstoe:

1. That length of The Avenue/Riseley Road (Route C8) which extends from a point approximately 147 metres north-east of its junction with Route A6 for a distance of approximately 417 metres to a point approximately 20 metres north-east of its junction with Cplowe Lane;
2. That length of Cplowe Lane (UC31) which extends for a distance of approximately 20 metres in a south-westerly direction from its junction with The Avenue/Riseley Road.
