end of New Littleport Bridge in the County of Cambridgeshire shall become a trunk road as from the date when the Order comes into operation; and

- (b) that the length of the London-King's Lynn Trunk Road (A10) which is situated between the starting and termination points of the route of the new trunk road shall cease to be a trunk road as from the date on which notice is given by him to the County Council of Cambridgeshire (who will become the highway authority responsible for that length) that the Ely and Littleport Bypass is open for through traffic; and
- 2. An Order under section 9 of the Highways Act 1959 authorising him:

(a) to improve, raise, lower or otherwise alter highways:

(b) to stop up highways;

(c) to construct a new highway to connect the super-seded trunk road with the above-mentioned trunk road; and

(d) to stop up private means of access to premises; all at Ely and Littleport aforesaid, and providing for the transfer of the said new highway to the County Council of Cambridgeshire as from the date on which he notifies the Council that the new highway has been completed and is open for through traffic.

The draft Order under section 7 of the Highways Act 1959 to which this notice relates in part reproduces the substance of "The London-King's Lynn Trunk Road (A10) (Ely and Littleport Bypass Part I) Order 197 " which was published in draft on 25th May 1978 and subsequently with drawn. Objections to the previous draft Order will be treated as objection to the draft section 7 Order to which this notice relates and may be added to or withdrawn as the objectors see fit.

The Taunton-Fraddon Trunk Road (A39) (Bideford) (Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting) Order 1979

The Minister of Transport has made an Order under sections 1 and 84D of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967 as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968 on the Taunton—Fraddon Trunk Road (A39) at Bideford in the District of Torridge in the County of Devon.

The effect of the Order, which comes into operation on 5th October 1979, is to:

(i) extend the prohibition of waiting at any time on the south side of Meddon Street from a point 10 yards west of its junction with Torridge Hill to a point 20

yards west of that junction;
(ii) extend the prohibition of waiting at any time on Clovelly Road from its junction with Geneva Place to a point 77 yards south-west of that junction; and

(iii) revoke and reimpose the remaining existing prohibi-tions and restrictions contained in the Trunk Road (Bideford) (Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting)

Order 1969 with the addition of the provisions of the Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Exemption for Disabled Persons) (England and Wales) (Amendment) Regulations 1975.

Exceptions have been provided in the Order to enable a vehicle to wait for so long as may be necessary for a person to board or alight from the vehicle, to enable goods to be loaded on to or unloaded from the vehicle, or to enable the vehicle to be used in connection with any building operation or demolition, the removal of any obstruction to traffic, the maintenance of the road or the services therein.

Any person who desires to question the validity of, or of any provision contained in, the Order, on the ground that it is not within the powers with respect to the Order conferred by the above Act, or on the ground that any requirement of, or of any instrument made under, any provision of that Act has not been complied with in relation to the Order may, within 6 weeks of 27th September 1979, apply to the High Court for the suspension or quashing of the Order or of any provision contained therein.
