
The Plan referred to in the foregoing Order in Council



At the Court at Buckingham Palace the 19th day of October 1979 Present,

The QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty in Council

Whereas the Secretary of State for the Environment after giving to the Priest-in-Charge and Churchwardens of the Parish of St. Margaret of Antioch, Huttoft, in the County of Lincolnshire, ten days' previous notice of his intention in that behalf, has, under the provisions of the Burial Act 1853 as amended by subsequent enactments, made a Representation to Her Majesty in Council that burials should be discontinued forthwith and entirely in the Churchyard of

St. Margaret of Antioch, in the said Parish, shown hatched

on the plan annexed hereto.

Now therefore, Her Majesty in Council is pleased hereby to give Notice of such Representation and to order that the same be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Privy Council on the 27th day of November next.

And Her Majesty is further pleased to direct that this Order be forthwith published in the London Gazette, and that copies thereof be affixed on the doors of the Churches or Chapels of, or on some conspicious places within, the Parish affected by such Representation one month before the said 27th day of November.
