The QUEEN has been pleased to issue an Amending Warrant under Her Majesty's Royal Sign Manual to the following effect:—

ELIZABETH R.

ELIZABETH THE SECOND, BY THE GRACE OF GOD OF THE UNITED KINGDOM OF GREAT BRITAIN AND NORTHERN IRELAND AND OF HER OTHER REALMS AND TERRITORIES QUEEN, HEAD OF THE COMMONWEALTH, DEFENDER OF THE FAITH TO ALL TO WHOM THESE PRESENTS SHALL COME, GREETING:

WHEREAS We did by a Warrant under Our Sign Manual dated the twenty-eighth day of October, one thousand nine hundred and fifty-five, institute and create a Medal designated the Colonial Prison Service Medal and did make, ordain and establish rules and ordinances for the governance of the same, reserving to Ourselves, Our Heirs and Successors full power of annulling, altering, abrogating, augmenting, interpreting or dispensing with the rules and ordinances, or any part thereof, by a notification under Our Sign Manual;

AND WHEREAS by Warrant under Our Sign Manual dated the fifteenth day of September, one thousand nine hundred and seventy-seven the Medal may be awarded to members of all ranks of Prison staff, and that previous service in the Police Force of a given Colony or Territory may be allowed to reckon towards the required period of qualifying service for the award of the Medal;

AND WHEREAS We now deem it expedient that the Warrant shall be further amended to permit the making of Regulations in the Colonies or Territories concerned;

NOW THEREFORE We do by these Presents for Us, Our Heirs and as follows:—

The following shall be inserted after Clause Twelfthly of the said Warrant: *Thirteenthly: Regulations.* Our Governor or Officer Administering the Government of the Colony, Associated State or Territory concerned shall issue from time to time, with the prior approval of one of Our Principal Secretaries of State such Regulations as to the grant, forfeiture, restoration and other matters as shall be necessary in order to carry out the purpose of this Our Warrant.

Given at Our Court of St. James's this Eleventh day of October, one thousand nine hundred and seventy-nine in the twenty-eighth Year of Our Reign.

Notice is hereby given that Her Majesty was pleased on the 19th October 1979 by Order in Council to confirm a Scheme No. 21 made by the Church Commissioners for appropriating the redundant church of Saint Margaret, Dalton-in-Furness, in the diocese of Carlisle, and part of the land annexed or belonging thereto, to use for worship, services and other activities of a religious nature in accordance with the rites and customs of the Roman Catholic Church and for purposes ancillary thereto; and empowering the said Commissioners to sell the said building and land for such uses; and for appropriating a further part of the said land to use for any ecclesiastical purpose affecting the parish of Dalton-in-Furness.

TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1971
