## CUSTOMS AND EXCISE

NOTICE OF SEIZURE UNDER THE  
CUSTOMS AND EXCISE MANAGEMENT ACT 1979

To: Cajetan Jones-Techie, The Friendship University, Moscow, USSR.

6th November 1979

Pursuant to section 139 (6) of the Customs and Excise Management Act 1979 and paragraph 1 of the 3rd Schedule thereto, the Commissioners of Customs and Excise hereby give you notice that by virtue of the powers contained in the customs and excise Acts and any enactments amending those Acts, certain goods, namely:

5. Russian ikons and 2 metal Russian church figures have been seized as liable to forfeiture upon the grounds that:

1. On 18th August 1979 at the Eastern Docks, Dover, in the County of Kent you knowingly made a statement in answer to a question put to you by an Officer of Customs and Excise which you were required by an enactment to answer, being an answer made for the purpose of an assigned matter, that was untrue in a material particular, namely you stated that you had nothing with you, that you intended to leave in the United Kingdom whereas the contrary was true.
2. On the said day at the said place the said metal church figures, being imported, were concealed in a woollen jumper in a manner appearing to be intended to deceive an Officer.
3. On the said day at the said place the said ikons were found with things liable to forfeiture.

Whereby and by force of sections 167 (1), 49 (1) (f) and 141 (1) (b) of the Customs and Excise Management Act 1979 the said goods are liable to forfeiture.

If you claim that the said goods are not liable to forfeiture you must within 1 month from the date of this notice of seizure give notice of your claim in accordance with the said Schedule to the said Act specifying the name and address of a Solicitor in England and Wales who is authorised to accept service of process and to act on your behalf. In default of such notice the said goods will be deemed to have been duly condemned as forfeited and will be liable to be disposed of in such manner as the Commissioners of Customs and Excise may direct. If you make such claim within the time aforesaid, legal proceedings will be taken for the condemnation thereof.
