The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modification, will be to divert for a period not exceeding five years, the public right of way No. 9B running from a point on the north-eastern side of the former workings known as Broombank for a distance of 310 m to the junction of Washpond Lane with Milberry

Green Road.

The alternative footpath will commence at a point on the north-eastern side of the former workings known as Broombank and proceed in a northerly direction for a distance of 358 m to a point south of the boundary of Washpond Lane, thence in a south-easterly direction along the southern boundary of Washpond Lane to the junction of Washpond Lane with Milberry Green Road and Public Footpath No. 9B for a distance of 194 m. (The footpath to be diverted is shown by a bold black line and the alternative path is shown by an interrupted

black line on the plan referred to in the Order.)

The alternative footpath will be stopped up at the expiration of a period of five years and the original footpath will be restored to a condition as substantially convenient to the public as it was prior to diversion.
