Lisbonne, May 29. The 26th inftant the Heer Oxenstern had his Audience from the Prince, in order to his departure, intending to embark on board Sir Edmard Sprage, who is to Convoy feveral ships bound for England as far as the Northern Cape, and then to go on board an Hamburger bound for Zealand.

The Loretto, a great Genouele vellel is gone to Oporto to bring about the new Portuguele Gallion that has been lome years building; two others thips are here fitting up, which with the faid Gallion are to guard the Coafts from the Turks at the return of the Brazile Fleet.

Vienna, fune 15. The Prince Ragotski has upon the endeavors of the Princefs his Mother, fubmitted himfelf to the Emperor and obtained his pardon, which has prevailed with the Rebels in the 13 Counties to lay down their Arms and make their fubmifsions: the young Prince feems to have been inveigled into this confpiracy by the enemies of the Empire, all whofe fubtle practices may be now detected, which tis believed had the fame Authors, and were carried on by the fame power which endeavoured alfo to involve Poland at the fame time in new diffurbances.

The young Prince is contented that two Garifons of the German forces shall be entertained within his Lordships; he engages to pay the Emperor a confiderable fum of Moneys, to assift the Emperor with his forces, and to deliver into his hand the principal Authors and Fomenters of the late troubles; with the original Papers of the whole confpiracy. The Imperial Army is about *Eperies* and *Casfouta*, where still the people much foruple the receiving of German Garifons. General *Spork* had intelligence of 5000 Hungarian Horfe which were in the Field with an intention to attempt upon him, but he drawing up his forces and preparing to Charge them, they retired, and fince fent fome Commissioners to fubmit thomselves to the Emperor as their Soveraign Lord and Prince.

We have by a later advice received the news that both both Eperies and Cafsovie have been content to take in an Imperial Garison, but that several of the rebellious Troops are retired towards Transylvania and other parts of the Turksh Dominions.

Genoua, June 18. The 14th inftant atrived here one of the Great Dukes Gallies from Palermo with many Bales of Silk for this place, and the fame day put to fea again for Legorn, whither failed yesterday the Dutch Convoy of two men of war and 6 Merchant ships. The fame day failed the Return for Zante and will in few days be followed by the Conclusion.

From Milan we are told, that the Duke d'Offuna the new Governor, having notice of the arrival of the Prince de Ligne upon the frontiers, fent two Companies of his Guards to receive him at Creme, who attended him to Lody, the first City belonging to the Dutchy of Milan, where the faid Prince was introduced with extraordinary honour by the Biflop of that City, the Prince Trivultio and feveral perfons of Quality, with a Train of above 20 Coaches with 6 horfes, the Canons difcharged, and feveral Volleys given him by the Foot Companies, he was honourably ci tertained at the Bihops Palace where he was complimented by a Gentleman fent by the Governour, which the Prince returned by one of his own Gentlemen. The Marquis de los Balb ces Spin la gave and received from him a visit, aften which the Prince took his way by Caflel Nuove towards Genoua.

The Prince de Ligne is lately arrived here and remains in o_i o, refi fing a Palace prepared for him in this City; five of the Gallies which attend for his Tranfortation, have been taking in foldiers at *Finale*, and are returned thence this morning. On Saturday the Prince intends (if not fooner) to embark and fet forwards towards his Vice-Royalty of \hat{S} cilj.

Hambourg, June 20. As yet the businels of Regenftein is not pait the diffute, the right to the place being ftill under confideration of the Mediatorswho endeavor, if possible, to fati fy all parties concerned, and to prevent the breach of the publick peace which was hereby much endangered ; the forces on each fide during the months truce agreed up-s; on between them, keep within their Quarters, their Officers being ordered to forb.a all hoftilities till fome effect appear of the Arbitration.

The Lorrain forces continue about Erfort, and the Countrey called Eisfeldt, being ready to be imployd by his Imperial Majefty with a fairs should require their affiltance.

Some late Letters from Vicnna tell us, that the diffurbances in Hungary are not yet composid, the inhabitants of the *Upper Hungary* being infinitely diffleafed at the procedure of the Imperial forces, infomuch, as they have drawn a confiderable firength together, intending to fland upon their Guard.

The Diet at Ratisbonne is now debating the differences between the House of Naffau and the Duke of Lorrain, the latter being unwilling to make refitution of the Lands belonging to the former, till the Moneys are paid for which they are engaged.

They are also confidering how to regulate Coins. The Comte d' Oeting has been complained of in the Affembly, that being a Protestant he refuses to permit the Roman Catholicks to have a free exercife of their Religion within his jurifdiction, where he pretends to a Spiritual as well as a Temporal power, in which the Comte defends himfelf, urging the like methods used by the Roman Catholicks againft the Protestants.

Bruffels, fune 27. His Excellency the Conftable of Caltille finding fome indifpolition of body, keeps himself retired, leaving all affairs to his Secretary, who this week received my Lord Caftlehaven on his

return from England to the Command of his Regiment.

The Adjutant-General of Battalia being ordered to arreft one Baron Butler, an Irifh Captain of Horfe for having forcibly releafed fome of his foldiers imprifond by the Governours Command; the faid Adjutant miftaking the name, feifed on Captain Porter on Tuefday laft in the Park at Bruffels, and was conveying him to the Caffle of Vilvord, but notice being prefently taken of the miftake, the Duke de Villa Hermofa, the General of the Horfe, immediately fent away a Poff, who called back Captain Porter on the midway to Vilvord, whom the Duke himfelf was pleafed to vifit at his Lodging with Don Antonio de Cordoua his Lieutenant-General, to excufe the error of the Adjutant, whom he ordered to be difcharged his employment, and imprifon'd, but pardon'd him upon the intercefsion of the faid, Captain Porter.

The fame Tuesday night happened a fire in the ftreet leading from the Jesuits Church to the Stone Port, by the accidental falling of a Squib into a Hay-loft, which in little time burnt down 11 or 12 Houses, and amongst others a very fair new house of the Count *de Brouay*.

The Conftables Baggage is carried to Offend, him, felf impatiently expecting the return of every Courrier for his difinifsion from the Government of these Provinces. He intending as soon as may be to depart hence by the way of France into Spain.

The Horfe continue their Quarters as formerly between this City, Malines, and Louvain, to the great trouble of the Countrey, the Deputies of the Province of Brabant are endeavouring to have them removed into Luxembourg, Limbourg, and Gueldren, but as yet without effect.

A Courier newly arrived from Spain tells hs, that as yet no Governor is appointed to fucceed the Constable of *Castille* in these Provincess Don *form* of *Austria* has been prefsed to accept of *Ix*, but he excuses himself, others have negotiated for the Prince of *Lorrain*, but as yet nothing is refolved.

Lendon, June 26. On Friday the 24th Inflant His Excellency Monfieur Colbert the Frenh Ambafsador, had an Audience from their Majeflieswith the ufual Ceremonies, condoling for the death of Madam, making after pards his Complements upon the fame account to their Royal Highnefses.
