### WATER ACT 1973

#### STATUTORY ORDERS (SPECIAL PROCEDURE) ACT 1945

*The Welsh Water Authority and North West Water Authority  
(Alteration of Boundaries) Order 1979*

The Secretary of State for the Environment, the Secretary of State for Wales, and the Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food hereby give notice:

(1) that they have made the Welsh Water Authority and North West Water Authority (Alteration of Boundaries) Order 1979 under sections 2, 8 and 36 of, and Schedule 2 to, the Water Act 1973;

(2) that the Order is to be subject to special Parliamentary procedure; and

(3) (in pursuance of section 2 (1) of the Statutory Orders (Special Procedure) Act 1945) that it is their intention to lay the Order before Parliament.

The Order alters the boundaries between the general areas and the sewerage and sewage disposal areas of the Welsh Water Authority and the North West Water Authority and makes transitional, supplementary and consequential provision for certain matters, including provision for differential sewerage charges in respect of part of the area transferred by the Order to the sewerage and sewage disposal areas of the Welsh Water Authority.

### HIGHWAYS ACTS 1959 TO 1971

*The Hungerford-Hereford Trunk Road  
(A345 Junction, Groundwell Corner) Order 19*  
and

*The Hungerford-Hereford Trunk Road  
(A345 Junction, Groundwell Corner, Side Roads)*

ORDER 19

The Minister of Transport hereby gives notice that he proposes to make the following Orders:

1. An Order under section 7 of the Highways Act 1959 providing:

(a) that a road about 0.89 kilometres in length which he proposes to construct at Groundwell Corner, starting at a point on the Trunk Road (A419) south-east of its junction with Highworth Road (B4019) and proceeding south-eastwards as far as Cricklade Road (A345) with which it forms a roundabout and then again proceeding south-eastwards to rejoin the Trunk Road all in the Parish of Blunsdon St. Andrew in the Borough of Thamesdown in the county of Wiltshire, shall become a trunk road as from the date when the Order comes into operation; and

(b) that the length of the Hungerford-Hereford Trunk Road to be superseded shall cease to be a trunk road as from the date on which notice is given by him to the County Council of Wiltshire (who will become the highway authority responsible for that length) that the trunk road is open for through traffic; and

2. an Order under section 9 of the Highways Act 1959 authorising him:

(a) to improve, raise, lower or otherwise alter Cricklade Road (A345),

(b) to stop up highways; and

(c) to construct new highways,

all at or near Groundwell Corner aforesaid, and providing for the transfer of each of the said new highways to the County Council of Wiltshire as from the date on which he notifies the Council that the new highways have been completed and are open for through traffic.

Copies of the draft Orders and of the relevant plans may be inspected free of charge at all reasonable hours from 27th February 1980 to 17th April 1980 at the Department of Transport, 2 Marsham Street, London S.W.1, and at the offices of the Regional Controller (Roads and Transportation) South West Region, Froomsgate House, Rupert Street, Bristol BS1 2QN, of the Wiltshire County Council, County Hall, Trowbridge of the Thamesdown Borough Council, Civic Offices, Swindon and at Penhill Library, Penhill Drive, Swindon.

Any person may not later than 17th April 1980 object to the making of the Orders, by notice to the Minister, at his address at the office of the Regional Controller (Roads and Transportation) South West Region, Froomsgate House, Rupert Street, Bristol BS1 2QN, quoting reference DSW 507909/TR43/TO15 and stating the grounds of objection. In the preparation of an objection and the statement of grounds of objection it should be borne in mind that the substance of any objection or representation may be communicated to other people who may be affected by it.

### TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1971

The Minister of Transport hereby gives notice that he has made an Order under section 209 of the above Act entitled "The Stopping-up of Highways (County of Durham) (No. 5) Order 1980", authorising the stopping-up of Havelock Street, Back Katherine Street South, Back Havelock Street East and lengths of Gurney Street and Back Gurney Street East all at Darlington, County Durham.

Any person aggrieved by the Order and desiring to question the validity thereof, or of any provision contained therein, on the ground that it is not within the powers of the above Act or that any requirement of that Act or of any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the Order, may, within 6 weeks of the 27th February 1980, apply to the High Court for the suspension or quashing of the Order or of any provision contained therein.
