

## EAST STAFFORDSHIRE DISTRICT COUNCIL

## HIGHWAYS ACT 1959, SECTION 111

*The District Council of East Staffordshire (Part of Public Footpath No. 4 Coton -in-the-Clay, Hanbury) Public Path Diversion Order 1980.*

Notice is hereby given that on 31st March 1980, the East Staffordshire District Council confirmed the above-named Order as an unopposed Order.

The effect of the Order, is to divert part of Public Footpath No. 4 Coton-in-the-Clay, Hanbury by the extinguishment of part of the public right of way running from the entrance to Coton Hall in a southerly direction for a distance of 20 metres, following the driveway and then turning south-east and running through the wooded grounds of the property for a further 25 metres, and then continuing in this direction for a further 68 metres crossing the property "Arnwood" and a track leading to Field No. 8613 and entering a wooded area to the west of Coton Hall Farm and by the creation of a new length of footpath from the wooded area to the west of Coton Hall Farm in a north-westerly direction for a distance of 28 metres entering "Arnwood" adjacent to the garage and then running alongside the eastern boundary for a distance of 10 metres to join the road.

A copy of the Order and the map contained in it has been deposited at the Secretary's Department, Town Hall, Burton-upon-Trent and may be inspected free of charge between the hours of 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. on Monday to Friday.

The Order becomes operative on 30th April 1980, but if any person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the Highways Act 1959, or on the grounds that any requirement of that Act or any Regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the confirmation of the Order they may under paragraph 2 of Schedule 2 to the Act as applied by paragraph 5 of Schedule 7 to the Act within 6 weeks from 4th April 1980, make application for the purpose to the High Court.

*North Yorkshire County Council Footpath No. 6 Sicklinghall Diversion Order 1980*

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order made on 10th March 1980 is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Department of the Environment for confirmation as an opposed Order, or to be confirmed as an unopposed Order by the North Yorkshire County Council.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modification, will be to divert the public footpath on land commencing at point "A" (marked on the map) which is adjacent to Paddock House, Sicklinghall which runs north eastwards across O.S. field No. 0034 to point "B" the latter being situated alongside the northern boundary of the above field, a total distance of 360 metres.

The new path will commence from point "B" and proceed westwards along the northern boundary of O.S. field No. 0043 for 128 metres then turn northwards into O.S. field No. 6772 where it links with existing footpath No. 5.

A copy of the Order and map contained in it has been deposited at the N.Y.C.C. Highways Divisional Office, Starbeck, Harrogate, and may be inspected free of charge during normal office hours.

If you wish to have sent to you in due course a notice to the effect that the Order has been confirmed and a copy of the Order as confirmed, you should write to the Chief Executive, North Yorkshire County Council, County Hall, Northallerton, giving your name and the address to which the documents may be sent.

Any representations or objections with respect to the Order may be sent to the Chief Executive at the above address before 6th May 1980, and should state the grounds on which it is made.

If no representations or objections are duly made, or if any so made are withdrawn, the North Yorkshire County Council may, instead of submitting the Order to the Secretary of State, themselves confirm the Order. If the Order is sent to the Secretary of State any representations and objections which have been duly made and not withdrawn will be submitted with the Order.

*North Yorkshire County Council, Wold House/Wardale House, Settrington Diversion Order 1980*

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order made on 20th February 1980 is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Department of the Environment for confirmation as an opposed Order or to be confirmed as an unopposed Order by North Yorkshire County Council.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modification, will be to divert that part of the footpath from High Street, Settrington across Town Wold (O.S. field 2283) from a point near to the north of Wold House which proceeds in a generally south-westerly direction and running south of Wardale House to a point in the south western corner of O.S. field 0824, a distance of about 830 metres. Thence from a point in the north eastern corner of O.S. field 6919 in a generally westerly direction across the said field O.S. 6919 to its junction with Horse Course Lane a distance of about 460 metres.

The new footpath will commence at the aforementioned point near to the north of Wold House and will run in a north westerly direction for about 40 metres, turn south to a point on the westerly boundary of O.S. field 5855 then west across O.S. field 4727 to the boundary of O.S. field 3336 then in a generally south westerly direction through field 3336 and O.S. field 2721 and then west along the southern boundary of O.S. field 0824, a total distance of about 940 metres; and will then run along the southern boundary of O.S. fields 8545 and 5938 to join Horse Course Lane some 170 metres north of the termination of the diverted path referred to above.

A copy of the Order and map contained in it has been deposited at the Highways Area Office, Westgate, Old Malton, Malton and may be inspected free of charge during normal office hours.

If you wish to have sent to you in due course a notice to the effect that the Order has been confirmed and a copy of the Order as confirmed, you should write to the Chief Executive, North Yorkshire County Council, County Hall, Northallerton, giving your name and the address to which the documents may be sent.

Any representations and objections with respect to the Order may be sent to the Chief Executive at the above address before 1st May 1980, and should state the grounds on which it is made.
