WAGES COUNCILS ACT 1979

Laundry Wages Council (Great Britain)

The Laundry Wages Council (Great Britain) hereby gives notice of proposals for (1) increasing the statutory minimum remuneration set out in the Wages (Laundry) Order 1980 (Order W (137)); and (2) the revocation of Order W (137).

The Wages Council intends that the revised provisions shall come into operation on 2nd June 1980.

Particulars of the proposals are contained in the Wages Council's Notice W (138), copies of which may be obtained on application to the Secretary of the Wages Council at the address given below. The Wages Council will consider any written representation with respect to the proposals if made within 14 days from 22nd April 1980. Any such representation should bear the writer's address and signature and be sent to the Secretary, Laundry Wages Council (Great Britain), 12 St. James's Square, London SW1Y 4LL. It is desirable that persons making objections should state the precise nature of their objections and quote the number of Wages Council's Notice of Proposals W (138).

SALMON AND FRESHWATER FISHERIES ACT 1975

THE THAMES WATER AUTHORITY AREA

To Owners and Lessees of Fisheries and Other Persons Interested

Whereas the Thames Water Authority has applied to the Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food for an Order under the above-mentioned Act to enable the Authority with the approval of the Minister, to erect and work fixed engines within its own area for taking or killing salmon and migratory trout for artificial propagation or scientific purposes or, except during the annual close seasons, for the purpose of sale.

Now notice is hereby given that it is the intention of the Minister to make an Order, a draft of which has been prepared.

New Zealand : Official Certificate
