

Ibstock, leading from Leicester Road (Route B591) to Spring Road which extends from a point at the southern apex of O.S. Parcel No. 1380 adjacent to Spring Road, Ibstock and proceeds in a north-westerly direction along the south-western boundary of O.S. Parcel No. 1380 for a distance of approximately 28 metres to a point adjacent to the south-east corner of O.S. Parcel No. 9882 and thence continues in a generally west-south-westerly direction along the south-eastern boundary O.S. Parcel No. 9882 for a distance of approximately 55 metres to a point approximately 29 metres north-east of the southern apex of O.S. Parcel No. 9882 to a line which extends from a junction with Spring Road at the north-east corner of O.S. Parcel No. 0669, in a north-westerly direction to follow the north-eastern boundary of O.S. Parcel No. 0669 for a distance of approximately 53 metres to rejoin the existing footpath, No. Q.90 at the point approximately 29 metres north-east of the southern apex of O.S. Parcel No. 9882 previously described.

A copy of the confirmed Order and the map contained in it is available for public inspection at Room 210, County Hall, Glenfield, Leicester.

The Order becomes operative as from the date of confirmation, but if any person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the Highways Act 1959 or on the grounds that any requirement of that Act or any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the confirmation of the Order, he may within 6 weeks from the date of this Notice make application for the purpose to the High Court.

*North Yorkshire County Council Magdalen Grange Farm,
Diversion of Bridleway Order 1980*

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order made on 26th March 1980, is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Department of the Environment for confirmation as an opposed Order, or to be confirmed as an unopposed Order by the North Yorkshire County Council.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modification, will be to divert the public bridleway which commences at the south eastern corner of O.S. field 3459 alongside the River Hartford (point A on deposited plan) and proceeds north-east to when it enters the farmyard of Magdalen Grange Farm, Muston (point E on deposited plan). After passing through the farmyard complex it runs south and south eastwards across O.S. Fields 6069, 5563, 7457 and 9748 to point D on deposited plan, a distance of 1,140 metres or thereabout.

The new bridleway will commence at Magdalen Grange Farm (point E on deposited plan) and follow the western outer perimeter of the farmyard complex in a generally southerly direction following the western boundary of O.S. field 5563 and a green lane to point F on the deposited plan, a distance of 360 metres. From this point the new route will split into two, one route will run westwards, the

other eastwards, alongside the River Hartford to connect with the original bridleway at points A and D respectively on the deposited plan.

A copy of the Order and plan contained in it has been deposited at the Library, 34 Stonegate, Hunmanby, Filey, and may be inspected free of charge.

If you wish to have sent to you in due course a Notice to the effect that the Order has been confirmed and a copy of the Order as confirmed, you should write to the Chief Executive, North Yorkshire County Council, County Hall, Northallerton, giving your name and the address to which the documents may be sent.

Any representations or objections with respect to the Order may be sent to the Chief Executive at the above address before the 16th May 1980 and should state the grounds on which it is made.

If no representations or objections are duly made, or if any so made are withdrawn, the North Yorkshire County Council may instead of submitting the Order to the Secretary of State, themselves confirm the Order. If the Order is sent to the Secretary of State any representations and objections which have been duly made and not withdrawn will be submitted with the Order.

Port of London Authority

Notice is hereby given that the Port of London Authority have applied to the Minister of Transport to make a harbour revision order under section 14 of the Harbours Act 1964.

The objects of the proposed Order are:

(a) to increase from £120 millions to £200 millions the total amount of moneys borrowed or raised by the Port of London Authority under section 48 of the Port of London Act 1968 and under certain provisions of earlier Port of London Acts that may be outstanding at any one time; and

(b) to provide for the auditor of the Authority's annual accounts to be appointed by the Authority (instead of by the Minister) and removing the requirement for the audit fee to be agreed by the Minister.
