Broxtowe Borough Council (Coateby Road) Public Path Extinguishment Order 1980

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order, made on 14th April 1980 is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment or to be confirmed as an Unopposed Order by the Broxtowe Borough Council.

The effect of the Order if confirmed without modification, will be to extinguish the Public Right of Way running from a point A thirty metres or thereabouts to the south of the junction between Coatsby Road and Holly Road, Kimberley to a point B one hundred and forty-four metres or thereabouts to the south-west of the point A being the junction of Footpath 25 and Footpath 27.

A copy of the Order and the map contained in it have been deposited and may be inspected, free of charge, at the Town Hall, Foster Avenue, Beeston, Nottingham, and the Council Offices at Hilltop House, Nottingham Road, Eastwood between the hours of 9 a.m. and 4.30 p.m. Monday to Friday.

Any representation or objection with respect to the Order may be sent in writing to the Director of Administration and Legal Services, Broxtowe Borough Council, Town Hall, Foster Avenue, Beeston, Nottingham before 2nd June 1980, and should state the grounds on which it is made.

If no representations or objections are duly made, or if any so made are withdrawn, the Broxtowe Borough Council may, instead of submitting the Order to The Secretary of State for the Environment, themselves confirm the Order. If the Order is submitted to the Secretary of State, any representations and objections which have been duly made and not withdrawn will be transmitted with the Order.

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Orders made on 18th April 1980 are about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for confirmation, or to be confirmed as unopposed Orders by the County Council of Cleveland.

The effect of the Orders, if confirmed without modifications will be as follows:

(a) to divert the length of footpath No. 5, Brotton extending from Low Farm in a generally south-westerly direction to a point near the allotment gardens to a route running from a point on footpath No. 6, 70 metres west of Low Farm in a southerly direction for a distance of approximately 290 metres, thence in a westerly direction for approximately 130 metres, thence in a north-westerly direction for approximately 120 metres, thence in a south-westerly direction for approximately 120 metres to rejoin the existing path.

(b) to extinguish the length of footpath No. 6, Brotton extending from Low Farm to a point 70 metres west thereof.

(c) to extinguish footpath No. 13, Thornaby extending from a point on Mitchell Avenue adjacent to Wolsingham Drive in an easterly direction for approximately 130 metres to its termination at Knighton Court.

Copies of the Orders and maps contained in them have been deposited and may be inspected during normal office hours at the offices of the County Secretary, Municipal Buildings, Middlesbrough, the Borough Secretary, Langbaugh Town Hall, Fabian Road, South Bank, Middlesbrough and the Town Clerk and Chief Executive, Stockton-on-Tees Borough Council, Municipal Buildings, Church Road, Stockton.

Any representation or objection with respect to the Orders may be sent in writing to the undersigned before 2nd June 1980 and should state the grounds on which it is made.

If no representations or objections are duly made or if any so made are withdrawn, the County Council of Cleveland may, instead of submitting the Orders to the Secretary of State, themselves confirm the Orders. If the Orders are submitted to the Secretary of State any representations and objections which have been made and not withdrawn will be transmitted with the Orders.
