Notice is hereby given that on 12th February 1980, the Gwent County Council confirmed the above-named Order.

The effect of the Order, as confirmed, is to divert the public right of way Footpath No. 350 on land opposite Llwynceilyn Terrace, Abercarn.

Part I. Description of Site of Existing Path

That part of the Footpath in the Parish of Ellingham in the District of New Forest on the Definitive Map of Public Rights of Way prepared under Part IV of the National Parks and Access to the Countryside Act 1949 as Footpath No. 26 which commences at the northern end of the footpath and runs generally south-westwards for 78 metres.

Part II. Description of Site of Alternative Highway

A 1.8 metres grass headland path which commences at the southern end of the path described in Part I of this Schedule and runs east-south-eastwards for 39 metres then northwards for 23 metres then eastwards for 25 metres to a stile. A total distance of 87 metres.

The County of Hereford and Worcester (Footpath No. 4, Overbury) Public Path Diversion Order 1980

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order made on 25th April 1980 is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation, or to be confirmed, as an unopposed Order, by the County Council of Hereford and Worcester.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modifications, will be to divert that length of footpath No. 4 in the Parish of Overbury commencing at a point situate at the terminus of the UC8622 Road from Overbury Village approximately 950 metres (1039 yards) of Park Farm and proceeding in a north-north-easterly direction for a distance of approximately 1602 metres (1752 yards) to terminate at a point at the path's junction with bridleway No. 3 in the Parish of Overbury, approximately 783 metres (856 yards) east-north-east of Park Farm, to a line commencing at a point situate on the northern side of the UC8620 Overbury to Conderton Road at Conderton Hill, approximately 1387 metres (1517 yards) south-south-east of the said Park Farm and proceeding in a north-north-easterly direction for a distance of approximately 1648 metres (1802 yards) to terminate at a point a distance of approximately 1177 metres (1287 yards) east of Park Farm. The total length of the existing path is approximately 1602 metres (1752 yards). The total length of the new path is approximately 1648 metres (1802 yards).

A copy of the Order and the map contained in it has been deposited and may be inspected free of charge at County Hall, Spetchley Road, Worcester and at the Wychavon District Council Offices, 37 High Street, Pershore between 9.30 a.m. and 12.30 p.m. and 2 p.m. and 4 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays.

Any representation or objection with respect to the Order may be sent in writing to the County Secretary and Solicitor, the County Council of Hereford and Worcester, County Hall, Spetchley Road, Worcester WR5 2NP, before 2nd June 1980 and should state the grounds on which it is made.

If no representation or objections are duly made, or if any so made are withdrawn, the County Council of Hereford and Worcester may instead of submitting the Order to the Secretary of State for the Environment, themselves confirm the Order. If the Order is submitted to the Secretary of State any representations and objections which have been duly made and not withdrawn will be transmitted with the Order.

Notice is hereby given that on 15th April 1980 the County Council of Hereford and Worcester confirmed the above-named Order.

The effect of the Order, as confirmed is to divert that length of Footpath No. 21 in the Parish of Kemerton commencing at its junction with Bridleway No. 23 in the Parish of Kemerton a distance of approximately 862 metres (958 yards) south-easterly of Woollas Hall and proceeding in an east-south-easterly direction for approximately 30 metres (33 yards) and thence in a southerly direction for approximately 267 metres (297 yards) to terminate at a point approximately 1095 metres (1217 yards) south-south-easterly of Woollas Hall, to a line commencing at a point on Bridleway No. 23 in the Parish of Kemerton a distance of approximately 206 metres (229 yards) west-south-westerly of the said point approximately 862 metres (958 yards) south-easterly of Woollas Hall, and proceeding in a south-easterly direction for approximately 257 metres (286 yards) to terminate at the said point, approximately 1095 metres (1217 yards) south-south-easterly of Woollas Hall.
