### NOTICE OF PUBLIC PATH ORDER

TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1971, SECTION 210

*The Derbyshire County Council (Public Footpath No. 57—Ripley) Public Path Diversion Order 1980*

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order (hereinafter referred to as "the Order") made on 24th April 1980, is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation or to be confirmed by the Derbyshire County Council as an unopposed Order.

The effect of the Order if confirmed without modification will be to divert for a period of 10 years or termination of the mineral extractions, whichever is the sooner, the public rights of way (more particularly described below) to allow clay excavation at Ripley:

*Public Footpath No. 57*, Ripley from Point A (GR4004 4869) in an easterly and north-easterly direction to Point B (GR4058 4886) a distance of 620 metres or thereabouts.

*Alternative Footpath* of 2 metres width commencing at Point A (GR4004 4869) and proceeding in a generally southerly direction to Point C (GR4001 4851) a distance of 185 metres or thereabouts and thence in a generally easterly direction to Point D (GR4062 4855) a distance of 650 metres or thereabouts.

A copy of the Order and the map contained in it has been deposited and may be inspected free of charge at County Offices, Matlock (Room 108), between the hours of 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. Mondays to Fridays and at the Offices of the Amber Valley District Council, Town Hall Ripley (Administration Department), during normal office hours.

Any representation or objection with respect to the Order may be sent in writing to the Clerk of the County Council, County Offices, Matlock, not later than Monday, 2nd June 1980 and should state the grounds on which it is made.

If no representations or objections are duly made, or if any so made are withdrawn, the Derbyshire County Council may instead of submitting the Order to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation themselves confirm the Order as an unopposed Order. If the Order is submitted to the Secretary of State for confirmation, any representations and objections which have been duly made and not withdrawn will be sent to the Secretary of State with the Order.
