- (a) (i) to carry out improvement of highways,  
(ii) to stop up highways,  
(iii) to construct new highways, and  
(iv) to provide new means of access to premises,  
all on or in the vicinity of the route of the above-mentioned part of the said Motorway; and
- (b) to provide for a new highway to be constructed for temporary purposes and to close that highway at the end of one month from the date on which he notifies the County Council of Hertfordshire that it is no longer needed for public use, and
- (c) to provide for the transfer of the new highway which is given the reference letter A in Schedule 2 to the Order to the County Council of Hertfordshire as from the date on which he notifies that authority that the new highway has been completed and is open for through traffic.

*The County Council of Humberside (Driffield By-Pass Classified Roads) (Side Roads) Order 1979*

**NOTICE OF APPLICATION TO VARY A COMBINED LICENCE TO OBSTRUCT OR IMPEDE THE FLOW OF AN INLAND WATER BY MEANS OF IMPOUNDING WORKS AND TO ABSTRACT WATER.**

Notice is hereby given that an application is being made to the Welsh Water Authority West Wales Division by W. R. H. Richards, Penybanc, Castlemorris, Haverfordwest, to vary the combined licence serial number 22/61/5/50/5.6 which refers to pond OS 9003 in field OS 0008 at Cotts Farm in the parish of Hasguard in the county of Dyfed as shown on OS Map SM 8410 8510 and to abstract water from the said inland water at or near that point.

The variation applied for is to increase the annual abstraction from 500,000 gallons to 1,000,000 gallons.

No alteration is necessary to the existing reservoir which is constructed to store in excess of 1,000,000 gallons of water.
