The Metropolitan Borough of Solihull SL67 Public Path Diversion Order 1980

Notice is hereby given that on 29th April 1980 the Metropolitan Borough of Solihull (hereinafter called "the Council") confirmed the above-named Order.

The effect of the Order as confirmed is to divert the Public Right of Way running from a point on the north side of the A34 some 75 metres north west of the junction of the said A34 with Monkspath Hall Road in a northerly direction to Brick Kiln Lane to a line linking the said point with the said Brick Kiln Lane and running firstly in a northerly direction along the western side of the said Monkspath Hall Road and then along the western side of Highlands Road, and running finally in a north easterly direction from the junction of the said Highlands Road with Radway Road to the said Brick Kiln Lane.

A copy of the confirmed Order and the map contained in it has been deposited at the Council House Solihull and may be inspected free of charge during normal office hours.

This Order become operative as from 29th April 1980 but if any person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971, or on the ground that any requirement of that Act or any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the confirmation of the Order, he may under section 245 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971 within 6 weeks from 10th May 1980 make application for the purpose to the High Court.

Tendring District Council (Footpath 22 Dovercourt) Public Path Diversion Order 1980

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order (hereinafter referred to as "the Order") made 24th April 1980, is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation, or to be confirmed as an unopposed Order by the Tendring District Council.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modification, will be to divert the public right of way running from point A on the Order Map at Abbott Road Dovercourt in a westerly and north-westerly direction for about 140 metres through points G and F to Point E to a line running in

generally north-westerly, north-easterly, south-easterly and southerly directions for a distance of about 200 metres from the aforesaid point A through points, B, C, D, to point E and shown by bold black dashes on the map referred to in the Order.

If no representations or objections are duly made, or if any so made are withdrawn, the Tendring District Council may instead of submitting the Order to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation themselves confirm the Order as an unopposed Order. If the Order is submitted to the Secretary of State for confirmation any representations or objections which have been duly made and not withdrawn will be sent to the Secretary of State with the Order. The Warwickshire County Council (Footpath M230, Great Packington and Meriden) Public Path Diversion Order 1980.

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order (hereinafter referred to as "the Order") made on 7th May 1980 is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation or to be confirmed by the Warwickshire County Council as an unopposed Order.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modification will be to divert that part of footpath M230 which runs from its junction with the A452 Oakley Wood-Stonebridge road 114 metres south-east of Molands Bridge over the River Blythe, first north-north-eastwards, along the south-eastern side of the field boundary for 110 metres then generally northwards for 580 metres to a point 170 metres south of Geary's Heath, to a line running from a point on the A452 road approximately 2 metres north-west of the footpath's existing junction with the A452 road, north-north-eastwards, along the north-western side of the field
