

The effect of the Order if confirmed without modification will be to extinguish the public rights of way (more particularly described below) to allow development to take place at Shipley Park in accordance with planning consent granted, and create alternative lines of paths (more particularly described below):

*Existing Footpaths to be stopped-up*

Public Footpath No. 8 Parish of Shipley from Point A (GR 444 447) in a south-easterly direction to Point B (GR 447 443) and thence in a southerly direction to Point C (GR 446 439) a distance of 925 metres or thereabouts.

Public Footpath No. 11 Parish of Shipley from the aforesaid Point B in an easterly direction to Point E (GR 447 443) and thence in a generally south-easterly direction to Point H (GR 449 441) a distance of 430 metres or thereabouts.

Public Footpath No. 28 Parish of Shipley from Point D (GR 447 445) in a southerly direction to the aforesaid Point E a distance of 202 metres or thereabouts.

Public Footpath No. 9 Parish of Shipley from Point G (GR 449 441) in a generally south-westerly direction to Point I (GR 446 439) a distance of 350 metres or thereabouts.

*Alternative Footpaths to be created*

From the aforesaid Point A in an east-south-easterly direction to the aforesaid Point D a distance of 390 metres or thereabouts.

From the aforesaid Point C in a north-easterly direction to the aforesaid Point H a distance of 360 metres or thereabouts.

From the aforesaid Point I in a south-easterly direction to the aforesaid Point C a distance of 26 metres or thereabouts.

From Point F (GR 448 445) in a south-south-easterly direction to the aforesaid Point H a distance of 515 metres or thereabouts.

Any representation or objection with respect to the Order may be sent in writing to the Clerk of the County Council, County Offices, Matlock, not later than Monday, 30th June 1980, and should state the grounds on which it is made.

If no representations or objections are duly made, or if any so made are withdrawn, the Derbyshire County Council may instead of submitting the Order to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation, themselves confirm the Order as an unopposed Order. If the Order is submitted to the Secretary of State for confirmation, any representations and objections which have been duly made and not withdrawn will be sent to the Secretary of State with the Order.

*The Borough Council of Vale of Glamorgan Footpath No. 28 Wenvoe Public Path Diversion Order 1980*

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order (hereinafter referred to as "the Order") made on 29th May 1980 is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for Wales for confirmation or to be confirmed by the Borough Council of Vale of Glamorgan as an unopposed Order.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modification, will be to divert the footpath numbered 28 from its junction with the county highway at the point where Old Port Road and the road to St. Lythans join at Rhiwau

Farm, approximately 250 metres south-west of Port Road and running generally north-westwards for approximately 515 metres to the entrance to the former Culverhouse Nurseries on the A48 highway, to a line commencing at the said point opposite Rhiwau Farm and running generally north-westwards for approximately 370 metres, then northwards for approximately 125 metres, then north-westwards for approximately 85 metres, then north-eastwards for approximately 65 metres to the said point at the entrance to the former Culverhouse Nurseries on the A48 highway and shall have a width of approximately 1 metre throughout.

**NOTICE OF CONFIRMATION OF PUBLIC PATH ORDER**

*The County Council of Somerset (Footpath No. DU4/26 at Exford) Public Path Diversion Order 1980*

Notice is hereby given that on 23rd May 1980 the Somerset County Council confirmed the above-named Order.

The effect of the Order as confirmed is to divert that part of footpath number DU4/26 in the Parish of Exford which starts at its junction with Church Hill and runs in an easterly and then in a north-easterly direction for a distance of approximately 194 yards; the new route to start at the former junction of footpath number DU4/26 with Church Hill and to run in a generally north-north-easterly direction for a distance of approximately 96 yards and then in a north-easterly direction for a distance of approximately 102 yards, a total distance of approximately 198 yards, to rejoin its former route.
