The Hertfordshire County Council Bridleway No. 9 (Part), (Parish of Buckland), Bridleway No. 1 (Part) and Bridleway No. 4 (Parish of Wyddial) Diversion Order 1980.

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order, made on 15th May 1980, is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation, or to be confirmed as an unopposed Order by the Hertfordshire County Council.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modification, will be to extinguish part of BR 9 Buckland, part of BR 1 Wyddial and BR 4 Wyddial. New bridleways will be created which keep to the field boundaries.

Staffordshire County Council (Public Path No. 26, Parish of Milwich) Public Path Diversion Order 1980

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order, made on 7th May 1980 is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation, or to be confirmed as an unopposed Order, by the Staffordshire County Council.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modifications, will be to divert that part of Public Footpath No. 26 in the Parish of Milwich between its junctions with the Stone-Uttoxeter Road B5027 and Narrow Lane, so that it leaves the Stone-Uttoxeter Road 140 metres west of its present junction, and then passes along Narrow Lane in a northerly than easterly direction for 270 metres to re-join the existing route.

Yeovil (Footpath Y.16/24 at Bower Hinton) Public Path Diversion Order 1980

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order, made on 27th May 1980, is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation, or to be confirmed, as an unopposed Order, by the Yeovil District Council.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modification, will be to divert that part of footpath Y.16/24 that runs from a point approximately 230 metres west of Broad Lane Track for approximately 90 metres in a northerly direction and then for approximately 240 metres generally in a north-westerly direction (total length 330 metres), to a line running from a point approximately 230 metres west of Broad Lane Track for approximately 169 metres in a westerly direction and then for approximately 166 metres in a north-north-westerly direction and rejoining the existing footpath (total length 335 metres).
