HE Dutchess of Mantua being dead lately in France, this Court are gone into Mourning for three Weeks on that occasion. the 13th Instant his Royal Highness was pleased to make a Promotion of General Officers, and has appointed the Baron de St. Remi, who is Lieutemant-General of Foot, to be Governor of Coni; he has likewise settled a Pension on that General, and given him a Commandery of a confiderable Value. Our last Letters from Vienna give us room to hope that Monsieur de Mellarede will succeed in his Negotiations, and that the Conferences now on Foot at that Court will have a better effect than any that have been heretofore held on the same Subjed. They write from Genoa, that they had Advice there that the Dutch Squadron was got fafe into Lisbon; and that a Catalan Bark was arrived upon the Coast, by which they are informed that a violent Storm ariting whilft the Confederate Fleet was weighing Anchor in the Road of Barcelona, the Resolution, a British Man of War, Founder'd under the Fort of Mountjuich, and lost about fifty of her Men, but the rest of the Fleet received no manner of Damage. We are affured that the Duke de Noailles's Army has been very much weaken'd by the Siege of Gironne, as well as by Sickness and Defertion, and that he has loft above five thoufand Men since he left Roussillon. His Royal Highness the Duke of Savoy has been lately indisposed of a Cold, which confined him for some time to his Chamber, but he is now much better,

Hague, March 17. N. S. Since the Arrival of his Grace the Duke of Marlborough, feveral Conferences have been held here, both in relation to the War and other publick Affairs. Commissioners have been likewise appointed to confer with Sir James Wishart on the Operations at Sea; and all imaginable Diligence is used on every side for an early Campaign. Lieutenant-General Cadogan set out Campaign. yellerday for the Netherlands, in order to give the necessary Directions for assembling the Body of Troops that are speedily to encamp near Orchies, and to dispose every thing for the opening of the Campaign, which is to be done by the whole Army the beginning of the next Month. The French Troops are in Motion from all Parts of that Kingdom towards the Frontiers, but their March has been much retarded by the ill Weather. The Earl of Orrery having delivered his Credentials to the States-General, has been fince in Conference with their Deputies. His Lordship has been vilited by all the Foreign Ministers here, and propofeth to be at Bruffels in a Fortnight, or three Weeks time. According to our Advices from Paris, the Mareschal de Villars was to set out for Arras the 18th Instant; and we are told the late Elector of Bavaria is speedily expected at Namur. These Letters add, that the Marquis de Leganez, heretofore Governor of Milan, died lately in his Imprisonment at Vincennes. Our Letters from Vienna advise, that the Prince of Savoy was to set out from thence the 10th or 12th Infant, in order to be at this Place before the end of the Month; and that the Turkish Aga was expected there the ther, contrary to the earnest Sollicitations of the French Ambassador, who made use of all his Interest to prevent it.
