This Order becomes operative when an alternative footpath referred to in the Order has been created to the reasonable satisfaction of the Council, but if any person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers that any requirement of that Act or any Regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the confirmation of the Order, he may within 6 weeks from 13th June 1980, make application for this purpose to the High Court.

The effect of the Direction is to require that an application for planning permission for development of theses classes should be made and granted before such development is carried out at any property or any land the subject of this Direction.

The properties the subject of this Direction are all within the conservation area although not all the properties within the conservation area are the subject of the Direction. A copy of the Direction and of a map defining the area to which it relates and defining the areas for which the particular classes of development will require *and* application for planning permission may be inspected at the offices of the Council's Chief Planning Officer, Sunnyfield House, Westgate, Guisborough, during Officer, Sunnyfield normal office hours.

# Teignbridge District Council Newton Abbot (Penn Inn No. 2) Public Path Diversion Order 1980

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order (hereinafter referred to as "the Order") made on 2nd June 1980 is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation or to be confirmed by the Teignbridge District Council as an unopposed Order.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modification, will be to divert footpath No. 32 in the Bushell Ward of the Parish of Newton Abbot which runs along the southern bank of the River Teign from the point of the present outfall of the Aller Brook into the River Teign in an easterly direction for a distance of 200 metres in a line parallel to the line of the original path but 8 metres to the south until it rejoins the line of the original path.
