TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1971

The Secretary of State for Wales hereby gives notice that he proposes to make an Order under section 212 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971 to extinguish any rights which persons may have to use vehicles on the length of highway specified in the Schedule to this notice.

The proposed Order will contain provisions for permitting the use of that highway by vehicles being used:

- (a) for Police, Ambulance or Fire Brigade purposes;
- (b) on behalf of a statutory undertaker, a water authority or the Post Office and engaged on the maintenance of their apparatus;
- (c) in accordance with the special authorisation for that use given by or on behalf of the Dyfed County Council, the Llanelli Borough Council or the Chief Officer of Police for that area; or
- (d) where the vehicle is an invalid carriage (mechanically, electrically, or hand propelled), or a vehicle which has been issued to a disabled person by the Government in lieu of an invalid carriage.

During 28 days from 21st June 1980 copies of the draft Order and relevant plan may be inspected at all reasonable hours at the offices of the Llanelli Borough Council, Town Hall, Llanelli and may be obtained free of charge from the Secretary of State (quoting Ref.
