The Buckinghamshire County Council (London Road, Loudwater) (Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting) Order 1980.

Notice is hereby given that on 9th June 1980 the Buckinghamshire County Council made the above-named Order under sections 1 (1), (2) and (3) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, Schedule 19 to the Local Government Act 1972 and Schedule 6 to the Road Traffic Act 1974.

The effect of the Order, which will come into operation on 23rd June 1980, is to prohibit waiting between 6 a.m. and 7 p.m. on Monday to Saturday in the length of road specified in the Schedule to this notice.

Exemptions to the Order will permit:

- (1) Waiting with the permission of a police constable in uniform or a traffic warden.
- (2) Waiting for so long as may be necessary: (a) for persons to board or alight; (b) for goods to be loaded or unloaded; (c) for enabling works to be carried out; (d) in pursuance of statutory powers or duties.
- (3) The waiting of Disabled Person's vehicles in accordance with the "Orange Badge" Scheme.
