TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1971—SECTION 210

Woodspring District Council (Footpath No. 13/13) No. 4 Public Path Diversion Order 1980—Moorfields, Silver Street, Nailsea.

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order (hereinafter referred to as "the Order") made on 4th June 1980 is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation or to be confirmed by the Woodspring District Council as an unopposed Order.

The effect of the Diversion Order if confirmed without modifications will be to divert a section of footpath 13/13 situated at Moorfields, Silver Street, Nailsea, to the County of Avon for a distance of 75 metres which said section runs diagonally from point A in Silver Street, across the site in a south-easterly direction to point B shown by a bold black line to a new line which runs from the said point A in a generally southerly direction, turning south-easterly to point B where it rejoins the original line of the path, a distance of about 83.5 metres shown by bold black dashes on the plan annexed to the Order.
