BARNESLEY METROPOLITAN BOROUGH COUNCIL

Carlton Marsh Nature Reserve

Notice is hereby given that on 13th June 1980 the Barnsley Metropolitan Borough Council, in pursuance of the powers conferred by sections 19 and 21 of the National Parks and Access to the Countryside Act 1949, declared that the land described below has been established as a local nature reserve under the provisions of that Act and is to be so managed.

Description of Land

Land containing an area of 35 acres or thereabouts situate on the southern side of Shaw Lane in the vicinity of Shaw Dike Bridge at Carlton, Barnsley, South Yorkshire, and extending in a southerly direction adjacent to the eastern boundary of the site of a dismantled railway.

Public Path Diversion Order 1979 (No. 2) Footpath 18 Darenth Road, Dartford

Notice is hereby given that on 17th June 1980 the Dartford Borough Council confirmed the above-named Order.

The effect of the Order as confirmed is to extinguish that section of footpath 18 commencing at a point 105 metres to the west of the junction of the footpath with Princes Road/Darenth Road, leading in a northerly direction for a distance of 560 metres to the footbridge over the River Darent, and in two branches, the first leading in a westerly direction opposite No. 87 Darenth Road for a distance of 110 metres to a point near the River Darent, the second leading from south of the footbridge over the the River Darent in a south-easterly direction for a distance of 115 metres to Darenth Road; and to create a footpath commencing at the junction of the existing footpath 18 with Princes Road/Darenth Road leading on the western side of Darenth Road in a north-north-easterly direction for a distance of 595 metres and then in a westerly direction for a distance of 75 metres to the footbridge over the River Darent, and in addition to create a branch commencing at a point 105 metres to the west of the junction of the footpath with Princes Road/Darenth Road, leading in a westerly direction for a distance of 60 metres to the River Darent.

A copy of the Order and the map contained in it has been deposited at the Council Offices, High Street, Dartford and at the Technical Services Department, 60-78 Highfield Road, Dartford and may be inspected free of charge between the hours of 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday to Thursday and 9 a.m. to 4.30 p.m. Friday.

The Order becomes operative as from 15th July 1980 but if a person aggrieved by the Order desires to question its validity or of any provision contained therein, on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the Highways Act 1959, as amended, or on the grounds that any requirement of the Act, as amended, or of any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the Order, he/she may under paragraph 2 of Schedule 2 of the Act as applied by paragraph 5 of Schedule 7 of the Act within 6 weeks from 19th June 1980 make an application for the purpose to the High Court.

Notice of Application to Stop up parts of the Highway known as Mercaston Lane, Brailsford, Parish of Hulland Ward.

Notice is hereby given that the Derbyshire County Council, being the highway authority for the highway hereinafter described, intends to apply to the Magistrates' Court sitting at the Town Hall, Ashbourne, on Thursday, 24th July 1980, at 10.30 a.m., for an Order under section 108 of the Highways Act 1959 authorising the stopping up of two parts of the highway detailed below, on the grounds that they are unnecessary. If such an Order is obtained the said land will cease to be part of the highway.

- (i) That part of the highway adjoining Mercaston Lane, Brailsford in the Parish of Hulland Ward within the curtilage of the property known as Gravel Pit Cottage, on its western side and comprising an area of 1,150 square metres or thereabouts.
- (ii) That part of the highway adjoining Mercaston Lane, Brailsford in the Parish of Hulland Ward within the curtilage of the property known as Mertondale, on its eastern side and comprising an area of 1,557 square metres or thereabouts.
