Wyre Forest District Council (Elmfield Walk and Field End, Stourport-on-Severn) Prohibition of Cycling Order 1980

Notice is hereby given that on 23rd June 1980, Wyre Forest District Council, with the consent of the Hereford and Worcester County Council, made an Order under section 1 (1), (2) and (3) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, the Local Government Act 1972 and the Road Traffic Act 1974, the effect of which will be to prohibit cycling between Elmfield Walk and Field End, Stourport-on-Severn in the county of Hereford and Worcester.

The Order will come into operation on 1st July 1980. SOUTH YORKSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL

South Yorkshire County Council (County Borough of Barnsley (Various Streets) Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting) Order 1971 (Amendment No. 1) Order 1980

Notice is hereby given that on 23rd June 1980 the South, Yorkshire County Council made an Order under section 1 (1), (2) and (3) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, Schedule 19 to the Local Government Act 1972 and Schedule 6 to the Road Traffic Act 1974.

The effect of the Order, which will come into operation on 22nd July 1980, will be to amend the County Borough of Barnsley (Various Streets) Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting Order 1971 insofar as it relates to the prohibition of waiting by vehicles at any time, by including the extended restrictions as specified in the Schedule to this Notice.

Exceptions to the Order will permit waiting for the purpose of picking up and setting down passengers, loading and unloading goods, in connection with building, industrial or demolition operations, the removal of obstructions to traffic, the maintenance of the roads and the services therein, the supply of gas, water and electricity, in pursuance of statutory powers or duties and for the collection and delivery of postal packets.

A further exception will permit waiting by a vehicle which displays the relevant disabled persons' parking badges for a period of up to 2 hours, return prohibited within 1 hour.

A copy of the Order and a map showing the roads the subject of the Order, may be examined during normal office hours at the offices of (i) the County Council, County Hall, Barnsley, and (ii) Central Library, Shambles Street, Barnsley.

If you wish to question the validity of the Order or of any of the provisions contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, amended as aforesaid, or on the grounds that any requirement of that Act or of any instrument made under it has not been complied with in relation to the Order, you may within 6 weeks from 23rd June 1980, apply to the High Court for this purpose.

Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting Order 19

- (a) To prohibit the waiting of vehicles at any time in the roads and parts of roads specified in column 1 of the Schedule to this notice.
- (b) To prohibit the waiting of vehicles between the hours of 8 a.m. and 6.30 p.m. from Mondays to Saturdays inclusive in the lengths of roads specified in column 2 of the Schedule to this notice.
- (c) To prohibit waiting by vehicles for more than 2 hours in any 4 hours between 8 a.m. and 6.30 p.m. Mondays to Saturdays inclusive in the lengths of roads specified in column 3 of the Schedule to this notice.

Exceptions to the Order will permit waiting for the purpose of picking up and setting down passengers, loading and unloading goods, in connection with building, industrial or demolition operations the removal of obstructions to traffic, the maintenance of the roads and the services therein, in pursuance of statutory powers or duties and for the collection and delivery of postal packets. The usual exceptions for disabled persons' vehicles are also included in the Order.

A copy of the Order and a map showing the restricted roads and a statement of the County Council's reasons for proposing to make the Order may be examined during normal office hours at the offices of (i) the County Council, County Hall, Barnsley, and (ii) the County Engineer, Cambridge House, Division Street, Sheffield.
