The County Council of Isle of Wight in exercise of their duty under Part IV of the above Act hereby give notice that all applications to the Crown Court as to the Provisional Map and Statement for the County of Isle of Wight having been heard and determined they have prepared a Definitive Map under section 32 of the Act in respect of the County together with the Statement containing particulars thereof.

The Definitive Map is a reproduction of the Provisional Map incorporating such modifications as have been requisite to give effect to the declarations made by the Crown Court under the above-mentioned applications.

In accordance with the provisions of the First Schedule, Part III, paragraph 9, of the above Act, if any person desires to question the validity of the Definitive Map on the ground that the map is not within the powers of the Act or on the ground that any requirement of the Act or of any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the preparation of the map, or of any draft or provisional map on which that map is based, he may, within 6 weeks after the date of publication of this Notice, make an application to the High Court.

The Ashford Borough Council (F.P. 294 (Part) Kingsnorth) Extinguishment of Public Right of Way Order 1980

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order, made on 4th July 1980, is about to be submitted to the Secretary

of State for the Environment for confirmation, or to be confirmed, as an un-opposed Order, by the Ashford Borough Council.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modifications, will be to extinguish the public right of way running from a point on the Ashford Road, Kingsnorth, 77 metres to the south-east of Ellingham Farm, for a distance of approximately 263 metres in a northerly direction to a point 160 metres from the southern end of the new estate road serving the Ellingham Farm Industrial Estate, such public right of way being part of Footpath No. F.P. 294.

The Ashford Borough Council is satisfied that a suitable alternative right of way will be provided over land specified in the Order.

If the Order is submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment, any representations and objections which have been duly made and not withdrawn will be transmitted with the Order.
