Whereas an Order in Council dated the 1st day of December 1955 sanctioned the institution of honorary rank so that officers who have served in the Royal Navy or Royal Marines in an acting rank for a minimum period of two years immediately before retirement should be permitted to use the title of the higher rank after their retirement:

And whereas it is considered desirable that the existing provisions as to honorary rank should be revised so that a commissioned officer in the Royal Navy, the Royal Marines, Queen Alexandra's Royal Naval Nursing Service and the Women's Royal Naval Service who retires on or after the 1st day of April 1980 should be permitted to use the title of the highest acting rank which he or she held, provided that such acting higher rank was held for an aggregate period of two years, or such shorter period as the Defence Council may in any individual case and by reason of special circumstances otherwise determine, and provided further that the officer concerned has given satisfactory service in such acting higher rank and subsequently:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

The conditions for the grant of honorary rank on retirement, as detailed here, shall be substituted for those contained in the Order in Council dated the 1st day of December 1955.

#### TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS

1. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Registrar's Office (Bank Buildings) at the Bank of England on Friday, 8th August 1980 at 1 p.m., for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act 1877, and the National Loans Act 1968, to the amount of £300,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000, £10,000, £25,000, £50,000, £100,000, £250,000 or £1,000,000. They will be dated at the option of the tenderer on any business day from Monday, 11th August 1980 to Friday, 15th August 1980 inclusive and will be due 91 days after issue.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000 and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated and the net amount per cent. (being a multiple of one new halfpenny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. Notification will be sent on the same day as Tenders are received to the persons whose Tenders are accepted in whole or in part. Payment in full of the amount due in respect of such accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of cash or by draft or cheque drawn on the Bank of England not later than 1.30 p.m. on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Bank of England.

8. The Lords' Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders. (30 SI)
