### Neston Conservation Area

Notice is hereby given that the Ellesmere Port and Neston Borough Council has designated an area at Neston in the County of Cheshire as a Conservation Area pursuant to section 277 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971.

The designated area includes most of the central shopping area of Neston, together with dwellings near the town centre. The main streets included are High Street, Liver-pool Road (part), The Cross, Parkgate Road (from The Cross to The Manse of the United Reformed Church), Cross Street, Park Street, Churchill Way, Mill Street, Buggen Lane (western part only) and Church Lane. The boundary extends from the north of the Malt Shovel Public House in Liverpool Road, then down Poplar Weint (a footpath) to its junction with Park Street. The boun-dary continues down the east side of Buggen Lane to its junction with Parkgate Road. From there the boundary follows the northern side of Parkgate Road for 40 metres to the east, then follows the boundary between the United Reformed Church and adjacent houses to the east, as far The designated area includes most of the central shopping Reformed Church and adjacent houses to the east, as far as the Wirral Way. From there the boundary follows the northern side of the Wirral Way Country Park to just beyond its junction with Church Lane excluding only the housing estate of Beechways Drive on the northern side of the Wirral Way. From Church Lane the boundary follows the south-westerly boundary of Comrades Field, and the
