

The effect of the Order will be to prohibit vehicles to enter the slip road which connects the northern (north-east bound) carriageway of the A.12 Witham Bypass with Colchester Road, Witham (B.1389).

The alternative route will be for vehicles to continue northwards to Kelvedon, through the underpass and then southwards on the A.12, exiting at the slip road which connects the southern (south-west bound) carriageway of the bypass with Colchester Road.

ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1967, SECTION 12 (1)

The Trunk Road (Colchester Northern Bypass) (A.12) (Temporary Prohibition and Restriction of Traffic) Order 1980.

Notice is hereby given that the Minister of Transport has made an Order on the London-Great Yarmouth Trunk Road (A.12).

The Order, which has been made to enable works to be carried out, will be in operation, when the appropriate signs are erected, from 8th September 1980 until such time as the works have been completed. The works referred to are associated with the construction of a bridge to carry the Colchester Eastern Bypass over the Colchester Northern Bypass.

The effect of the Order will be to close the southern (westbound) carriageway of the trunk road from a point 122 metres east of Whitehouse Bridge (A1232) to a point 107 metres west of Severalls Lane Bridge. Traffic on the southern (westbound) carriageway will be diverted onto the fast lane of the northern (eastbound) carriageway. The northern (eastbound) carriageway will also be closed between a point 324 metres west of Whitehouse Bridge and a point 400 metres east of Severalls Lane Bridge and both eastbound and westbound traffic will be diverted onto a newly constructed road between these two points. The lengths of closure and nature of diversions may be changed, where works demand, but within the lengths quoted above and, at all times, the prohibitions and restrictions imposed will be signed in accordance with the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 1975.

Overtaking will be prohibited on both carriageways and on the diversions throughout the lengths quoted in the Order.

It is envisaged that the works should be completed within 12 months and that the Order will be in effect for that time with the exclusion of the months of July and

August during which the trunk road will be restored to normal working.

The Trunk Road (High Street, Stony Stratford) (A.5) (Prohibition of Driving) Order 1980

The Minister of Transport has made an Order under sections 1 and 84D of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967 as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968 on the London-Holyhead Trunk Road (A.5) at Stony Stratford in the County of Buckinghamshire.

The effect of the Order, which comes into operation on 8th September 1980, is to revoke the Trunk Road (High Street, Stony Stratford) (A.5) (Prohibition of Driving) Order 1980 and to re-enact its provision with an exemption for the following:

- (a) any vehicle being used in connection with the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the trunk road;
- (b) any vehicle being used in connection with the laying, erection, alteration or repair in or near the trunk road of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telegraphic line as defined in the Telegraph Act 1878;
- (c) any vehicle being used in the service of a local authority or of a water authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties;
- (d) any vehicle being used for police, ambulance or fire brigade purposes; or
- (e) any vehicle being used in the service of the Post Office for the purpose of gaining access to or egress from telegraphic plant.

Any person who desires to question the validity of the Order or of any provision contained therein, on the ground that it is not within the powers with respect to the Order conferred by the above Act, or on the ground that any requirement of any provision of that Act, or of any instrument made thereunder, has not been complied with in relation to the Order, may within 6 weeks of 2nd September 1980, apply to the High Court for the suspension or quashing of the Order or of any provision contained therein.
