

the north-eastern corner of that plot whereupon it turns secondly to run in an irregular south and south-easterly direction along the eastern boundaries of O.S. Plot Nos. 29 and 31 for a distance of some 270 yards joining the track running into the farmyard of Higher Withecombe Farm in the south-easterly corner of O.S. Plot No. 31 going into the farmyard through the gate situated there thirdly crossing the northern part of the farmyard in an irregular south-westerly direction passing to the east of the farmhouse buildings for a distance of some 60 yards and going into O.S. Plot No. 51 (SX 6989) through the gate near the eastern part of the farmhouse and finally running in a southerly direction across the southern-most part of the farmyard complex for a distance of some 50 yards keeping always to the western boundary of O.S. Plot No. 51 to the above-mentioned point which lies at the gate giving access from the track referred to as O.S. Plot No. 54 to O.S. Plot No. 61.

(b) commencing at a point which lies in the corner of O.S. Plot No. 59 (SX 7088) where that plot adjoins O.S. Plot No. 2948 (SX 7088) and the woodland known as O.S. Plot No. 2469 (SX 7088) and proceeding in an irregular north-westerly direction firstly for a distance of some 185 yards along the north-eastern boundary of O.S. Plot No. 59 secondly through the gate connecting O.S. Plot Nos. 59 and 78 (SX 7088) and thirdly for a distance of 65 yards along the north-eastern boundary of O.S. Plot No. 78 towards a point which lies at the gate on that aforementioned boundary some 5 yards to the south-east of the connection of the boundary walls separating O.S. Plot Nos. 981 and 84 and 981 and 78 (SX 7088) in the parish of Chagford to a line commencing at the above-mentioned point which lies in the corner of O.S. Plot No. 59 where that plot adjoins O.S. Plot Nos. 2948 and 2469 and proceeding firstly in a north-easterly direction through the boundary walls separating O.S. Plot Nos. 59 and 2469 into the wood referred to as O.S. Plot No. 2469 whereupon it turns to run secondly in an irregular north-westerly direction along the western boundary of O.S. Plot Nos. 2469 and 1871 (SX 7088) for a distance of some 100 yards and thirdly through the gap in the hedge separating O.S. Plot Nos. 1871 and 981 to follow for a distance of some 150 yards the southern boundary of O.S. Plot No. 981 towards the gate in the north-western corner of O.S. Plot No. 981 which gate is situated at the point which lies some 5 yards to the south-east of the connection of the boundary walls separating O.S. Plot Nos. 981 and 84 and 981 and 78 in the Parish of Chagford.

(c) commencing at a point which lies on the track running from the county road joining Sandy Park with Rushford Bridge in the Parish of Chagford to the buildings on O.S. Plot No. 1953 (SX 7088) some 285 yards along that track to the west of its junction with the aforementioned County road and proceeding in an easterly direction along that track and then turning and proceeding in a south-easterly direction through the gate in the north-western corner of O.S. Plot No. 4849 (SX 7088) and along the western boundary of O.S. Plot Nos. 4849 and 4535 (SX 7088) for a distance of some 255 yards towards a point on the route of Public Footpath No. 16 in the Parish of Chagford shown on the definitive map for the public rights of way in Devon which said point is situated in the south-western corner of O.S. Plot No. 4535 beside the stream which joins the River Teign some 270 yards to the east near Rushford Mill Farm in the Parish of Chagford and some 15 yards along the riverbank to the west of the footbridge connecting O.S. Plot Nos. 4535 and 5035 (SX 7088) to a line commencing at the above-mentioned point which lies on the track running from the County road joining Sandy Park to Rushford Bridge to the building in O.S. Plot No. 1953 some 285 yards along that track to the west of its junction with the aforementioned County road and proceeding in a south-easterly direction along the eastern boundary of O.S. Plot No. 2948 for a distance of some 260 yards to the south-east corner of O.S. Plot No. 2948 where it reaches the track known as Public Footpath No. 16 in the Parish of Chagford running beside the stream which connects into the River Teign at Rushford Mill Farm at a point some 275 yards along the stream to the west of its confluence with the main river.

Copies of the Orders as confirmed and the maps contained in them have been deposited and may be inspected free of charge at the District Council Offices, Kilworthy

Hill, Tavistock, between 9 a.m. and 12.45 p.m. and 1.45 p.m. to 4.30 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays.

Any person who wishes to claim compensation under section 31 of the 1959 Act for depreciation or damage in consequence of the coming into operation of the Orders must make his claim in writing addressed to the Chief Executive and Secretary, West Devon District Council, Council Offices, Kilworthy Hill, Tavistock, Devon, and serve it by delivering it at or sending it by prepaid post to the above address before 12th March 1981.

The Orders become operative as from 12th December 1980, but if any person aggrieved by the Orders desires to question the validity thereof, or any of the provisions contained therein, on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the Highways Act 1959, as amended, or on the grounds that any requirement of the Act, as amended, or of any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the Orders, he may, under Paragraph 2 of Schedule II of the Act, within 6 weeks from 12th September 1980, make an application to the High Court for this purpose.

NOTICE OF PUBLIC PATH ORDER

HIGHWAYS ACT 1959

COUNTRYSIDE ACT 1968

The West Devon District Council Public Footpath Number 4 (Part) in the Parish of Whitchurch and Public Footpath Number 1 in the Parish of Horrabridge Public Path Diversion Order 1980.

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order, made on 12th September 1980, is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation or to be confirmed as an unopposed Order by the West Devon District Council.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modifications, will be to divert that part of the Public Footpath Number 4 in the Parish of Whitchurch and Public Footpath Number 1 in the Parish of Horrabridge shown on the Definitive Map for Public Rights of Way in Devon commencing at a point on Footpath No. 4 in the Parish of Whitchurch in O.S. Plot No. 7313 (SX 5071) where that plot adjoins the south-western corner of O.S. Plot No. 7915 (SX 5071) and proceeding in a southerly direction across O.S. Plot Numbers 7313 and 7405 (SX 5071) for a distance of some 57 yards until the Parish Boundary is reached when the footpath becomes Public Footpath Number 1 in the Parish of Horrabridge and continues to proceed in a southerly direction across O.S. Plot Nos. 7102 and 7601 (SX 5071) and O.S. Plot No. 7786 (SX 5070) for a distance of some 80 yards until a point is reached where that footpath intersects Public Footpath Number 2 in the Parish of Horrabridge to a line commencing at the point in O.S. Plot No. 7313 where that plot adjoins the south-western corner of O.S. Plot No. 7915 and proceeding in a south-south-easterly direction across O.S. Plot Nos. 7313 7405 (SX 5071) for a distance of some 5 yards until the parish boundary is reached whereupon the footpath will become known as Public Footpath Number 1 in the Parish of Horrabridge and continues to proceed in a south-south-easterly direction across O.S. Plot No. 7102 (SX 5071) for a distance of some 15 yards until the boundary of that plot with the northern-most point of O.S. Plot No. 7601 (SX 5701) is reached whereupon the footpath runs in a south-easterly direction along the north-eastern boundary of O.S. Plot No. 7602 and the eastern boundary of O.S. Plot No. 7786 for a distance of some 130 yards towards a point on Public Footpath Number 2 in the Parish of Horrabridge which lies some 110 yards east-south-east of the above-mentioned position on Public Footpath Number 2 in the Parish of Horrabridge.

A copy of the Order and the map contained in it has been deposited and may be inspected free of charge at the District Council Offices, Kilworthy Hill, Tavistock, between 9 a.m. and 12.45 p.m. and 1.45 p.m. and 4.30 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays.
