

at Vienna, that the Differences between his Imperial Majesty and the Duke of Savoy would speedily be accommodated. We have Letters from Madrid of the 23d of March, advising, that the Portuguese had surpriz'd and taken the strong Town of Miranda de Duero, and made the Garrison, consisting of one thousand Men, Prisoners of War. The Marquis de Bay having notice of the danger the Town was in, was marching to succour it; but the Portuguese were so expeditious, that they made themselves Masters of it before he had time to come up to its Relief. My Lord Raby arriv'd here the 8th Instant in the Evening: He was yesterday in Conference with the Pensionary, and is to deliver his Credentials to Morrow. The Duke of Argyle continu'd his Journey to Spain on Wednesday last from Rotterdam.
