#### COLCHESTER BOROUGH COUNCIL

##### *The Colchester Borough (Church Road, West Mersea) (Restriction of Waiting) Order 1980*

Notice is hereby given that the Colchester Borough Council, as agents for the Essex County Council, have made an Order under section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended, the effect of which will be as follows:

- (a) To prohibit waiting between 9 a.m. and 7 p.m. on all days of the week on the side of the road specified in Schedule 1 to this notice; and
- (b) To limit waiting to 30 minutes between the hours of 9 a.m. and 7 p.m. on all days of the week on the side of the road specified in Schedule 2 to this notice.

The Order, which will come into operation on 29th September 1980, does not prevent vehicles from waiting for the purpose of loading or unloading goods, allowing passengers to board or alight or to enable works to be carried out in the road. Exceptions in the Order also permit the waiting of disabled persons' vehicles in accordance with the Orange Badge Scheme.

A copy of the Order and a map showing the lengths of road to which the Order relates may be inspected at my office during normal office hours.

Any person who desires to question the validity of the Order or of any provision contained in the Order on the ground that it is not within the powers of the said section 1 or on the ground that any requirement of that section or of section 84A, 84B, or 84C of the said Act or any regulations made under the said section 84C has not been complied with in relation to the Order may, within 6 weeks from 18th September 1980, make application to the High Court.

##### *The Colchester Borough (The Lane, West Mersea) (Width Restriction) Order 1980*

Notice is hereby given that the Colchester Borough Council, as agents for the Essex County Council, have made an Order under section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended, the effect of which is to prohibit the driving of any vehicles the width of which, inclusive of any load on the vehicle, exceeds 6 feet in that length of The Lane, West Mersea, which extends from point 115 feet, from its junction with Coast Road, eastwards, for a distance of 55 feet. ##### *The Colchester Borough (Street Parking Places) (Marks Tey) Order 1980*
