T is generally reported here, that the English and Dutch Squadrons under the Command of the Admirals Jennings and Pieterson, are arriv'd at Barcelona. This Account is are arrive at Barcelona. A Council of War heing appointed to be held at Saragosia in the Pre-fence of the Duke of Anjou, the Duke of Noailles was set out for that Place, and all the other General Officers are order'd to attend, and deliver their Opinions as to the most essecual Methods that shou'd be propos'd for providing Necessaries for the Army, and carrying on the War. Several English Officers that were Prisoners of War at Madrid, are removed from thence to Segovia, and some of the Inhabitants have been confin'd upon a Suspicion of their having maintain'd too close 2 Correspondence with those Officers. the fine Furniture belonging to the Dutchess of Anjou's Apartment at Madrid, is sent from thence to Saragossa, where it is said she intends to reside

during the Operations of the ensuing Campaign.
