Excess Charges

For overstaying time allowed by payment or failure to pay and charge or display a valid ticket, £4.

For overstaying time allowed by payment (by immediate purchase of tickets from ticket machine before leaving car park), 50p.

Motor Cycles

Free parking in defined areas of the ground floors of John Street, Islington Street and Spring Gardens Multi Storey Car Parks and also in defined areas of certain surface car parks. (Prohibited above ground floor level in all Multi Storey Car Parks.)

A copy of the Order is available for inspection at the offices of the Director, Technical Services, Thamesdown Borough Council, Princes House, Princes Street, Swindon, during normal office hours.

Any person who desires to question the validity of the Order or of any provision contained in the Order on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the relevant sections of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended or on the grounds that any requirement of those sections or of sections 84A, 84B or 84C of the Act or any regulations made under the said section 84C has not been complied with in relation to the Order may within 6 weeks from 22nd October 1980, make application for the purpose to the High Court.

The Order will be operative as from 10th November 1980.

NOTICE OF PUBLIC PATH ORDER

The City of Birmingham District Council (Walmley Ash Road—Fox Hollies Road, Walmley) Public Path Diversion Order 1980.

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order (hereinafter referred to as "the Order") made on 27th October 1980 is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation or to be confirmed by the City of Birmingham District Council as an unopposed Order.

The effect of the Order if confirmed without modification will be to divert the length of footpath (being part of the footpath running between Fox Hollies Road and Walmley Ash Road, Sutton Coldfield, which is shown as Number SC21 on the Warwickshire Definitive Map of Public Rights of Way) commencing at a stile at the point shown marked A on the plan annexed to the Order and running on the north-west side of a field hedge in a south-westerly direction for a distance of approximately 243 yards to the point shown marked B on the said plan to a line commencing at the said point shown marked A on the said plan and running on the north-east side of the said field hedge in a south-westerly direction for a distance of approximately 243 yards to rejoin the original path at the point shown marked B on the said plan.

A copy of the Order and the map contained in it has been deposited at the office of the City Solicitor, Paradise Place, Birmingham B3 3EH, and may be inspected free of charge at the office during normal working hours (Mondays to Thursdays 8.45 a.m. to 5.15 p.m., Fridays 8.45 a.m. to 4.15 p.m.).

Any representation or objection with respect to the Order may be sent in writing to the City Solicitor at the above address quoting reference P/I/9189 not later than 28th November 1980 and should state the grounds on which it is made.

If no representations or objections are duly made or if any so made are withdrawn the City of Birmingham District Council may instead of submitting the Order to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation themselves confirm the Order as an unopposed Order. If the Order is submitted to the Secretary of State for confirmation any representations and objections which have been duly made and not withdrawn will be sent to the Secretary of State with the Order.
