

When that Conference was over he went into the Chamber of Treves, where he acquainted the Ministers of the Powers concern'd, that the eight Palatin Battalions were already on their March; and at the same time recommended to 'em, that the several Quota's of their respective Masters might be ready to meet them at the place of Rendezvous. To prevent any Contest about the Command of those Forces it is agreed, that a Superior Commission be given to the Emperor's Officer, which shall entitle him to a Precedency for the present. Mr. Whitworth, the Queen of Great Britain's Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary to his Czarish Majesty, set out from hence yesterday in the Morning for Berlin.
