

that they were regulating the Conditions when the Express was sent away. The Empress-Dowager has taken off the Excise laid upon Bohemia, which it is thought will be a means to keep the Inhabitants of that Kingdom firm in their Allegiance. On Saturday last the Prince of Savoy set out from this Place for the Army. He din'd at Rotterdam, where he went on Board a Yacht appointed to carry him from thence to Ghent. It is said, the French have order'd several Battalions and Squadrons to March out of Dauphiné to the Rhine, and that all the Troops under the Command of the Duke of Noailles in Catalonia, except some Battalions that are left in Gironne, have receiv'd Orders to March into Dauphiné. The Confederate Army continues in the Camp near Douay; from whence we hear, that the Enemy are hard at Work in making Intrenchments, and fortifying their Lines. A large Convoy from England, having a great number of Recruits on Board, arriv'd safe in the Maese on Sunday the 10th Instant. Mr. Palmes set out yesterday for Rotterdam, in order to embark on Board the first Packet-boat for England.

The Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty having ordered all the Foremast Men belonging to Her Majesty's Ship the Crown to be removed into the Chichester, to serve in her, and to be paid their Wages there; Their Lordships are pleased to direct, That the said Men do forthwith repair Aboard the Chichester or Blackstake or the Nore, otherwise they will be taken up and prosecuted as Deserters.
