General

2. The Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions (Pay and Allowances) (No. 2) Order 1980 shall have effect subject to the provisions contained in the Schedules to this Order.

3. Payment of basic pay and allowances shall be made in accordance with Schedule 1 to this Order. 4. Flying Pay for Royal Marine Aircrew Observers shall

be paid in accordance with Schedule 2 to this Order.

SCHEDULE 1

Method of payment

The method of payment to Royal Navy and Royal Marine personnel (i.e. payment in cash or by direct credit to the individual's personal bank account) shall be at the discretion of the Admiralty Board.

SCHEDULE 2

Royal Marine Aircrew Observers

With effect from 1st November 1975 Royal Marine Air-crew Observers Pay shall be payable to personnel who are selected for training and subsequently employed as qualified Royal Marine Aircrew Observers. (1 SI)

Whereas it is expedient to provide for the increase of certain pensions granted in respect of service in Her Majesty's Naval and Marine Forces to correspond, as nearly as may be, with the benefits provided, in the case of civil pensions, by the Social Security Pensions Act 1975 (1975 c.60), as amended by the Social Security Act 1979 (1979 c.18).

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, in exercise of the powers conferred upon Her by section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act 1865 (1865 c.73), and of all other powers enabling Her in that behalf, is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered as follows: hereby ordered, as follows:

Citation

1. This Order may be cited as the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions (Pensions Increase) (No. 2) Order 1980. General

2. Except as otherwise indicated, the provisions con-tained in the Schedule to this Order shall have effect from 24th November 1980.

SCHEDULE

- 1. A pension to which this Schedule relates shall be:
- (a) Officers' service retired pay, service invaliding retired pay, service attributable retired pay, compassionate allowances, the service portion of disability retired pay, and a preserved pension.
- (b) Service retired pay, preserved pension, service invaliding retired pay, service attributable retired pay and the service portion of disability retired pay of officers of the Women's Royal Naval Service and of Queen Alexandra's Royal Naval Nursing Service and Nursing Service Reserve and of the Naval Nursing Auxiliary Section.
- (c) Men's and women's service pension, preserved pen-sion, service invaliding pension and service attributable pension including elements for rank and age and additions for war service.

- (d) Pensions payable under Order in Council of 23rd May 1952 and previous Orders relating to Riggers and Yardcraft personnel.
- (e) Pensions payable under Order in Council of 20th November 1959 and previous Orders relating to European and Indian members of the Hong Kong Dockyard Police.
- (f) Pensions payable under Order in Council of 20th November 1959 and previous Orders relating to European and Indian (or otherwise Asian) members of the Singapore Dockyard Police.
- (g) Pensions payable under Order in Council of 23rd May 1952 and previous Orders relating to certain Shipwrights.
- (h) Family pensions including Attributable Forces Family Pensions and short-term family pensions.
- (i) Pensions for distinguished conduct. (Additions to pensions in respect of gallantry awards shall for the purposes of this Schedule be regarded as forming parts of the pensions to which they are attached).
- (j) Meritorious service annuities payable to Royal Marines when the recipient is also receiving another pension increasable under this Order.
- (k) Retired Officers' Naval pensions and good service pensions.
- (1) Any award increased or increasable under Orders in Council of 13th August 1920 or 8th December 1924.
- (m) Pensions payable under Order in Council of 27th February 1961 and previous Orders relating to officers of the Royal Fleet Auxiliary Service.
- (n) Service retired pay of officers of the former Royal Indian Navy.
- (o) Ex-gratia payments to officers, RN ratings and RM other ranks invalided since 1st August 1969 as a direct result of terrorist activity in Northern Ireland, and to widows and children of those killed since 1st August 1969 as a direct result of terrorist activity in Northern Ireland.

2. A pension to which this Schedule relates may be increased provided either that:

- (a) the pensioner has attained the age of 55 years or the pension is a widow's pension; or
- (b) the pensioner is receiving a pension as a child of a deceased officer, rating or other rank ; or
- (c) the pensioner was invalided from naval service with service invaliding retired pay/service invaliding pension or service attributable retired pay/service attributable pension; or
- (d) the pensioner is permanently incapacitated by physical or mental infirmity from engaging in regular fulltime employment.

3. Subject to the provisions of paragraph 4 hereafter the increase shall comprise the appropriate percentage as set out in paragraph 5 hereafter of the retired pay or pension being paid to the pensioner at the time when the increase becomes payable, including any pension increases awarded or for which he may become eligible under the former Pensions Increase Orders in Council.

- 4.—(a) In implementing the provisions of paragraph 3 hereof, a fraction of a pound in an annual rate of pension shall be treated as a whole pound and up to 31st March 1969, a fraction of ± 0.025 in a weekly rate of pension shall be treated as ± 0.025 for the purpose of calculation only. From 1st April 1969, this increase shall be calculated on the actual pension in payment. The increases shall be added to the actual pension in payment.
- (b) Where commutation is effected on or after 9th November 1980 the amount commuted shall be included, as if it were still part of the pension in assessing the increase admissible.

5. The appropriate percentage increase shall be as follows:

- (a) 16.5 per cent. for retired pay and pensions which began before 12th November 1979.
- (b) 16.5 per cent. for family pensions, awarded at minimum rates, or which began before 12th November 1979.

(c) For retired pay and pensions which began on or after 12th November 1979 the increases shall be as follows:

- (d) For family pensions which began on or after 12th November 1979 the percentage which would have been awarded to the officer, rating or other rank from whose service the pension is derived had the officer, rating or other rank been alive and eligible for pensions increase, whether or not the husband qualified for these increases by virtue of age or health.
- (e) In the case of family pensions awarded to widows of Admirals of the Fleet which were based on the husband's rate of half pay, 16.5 per cent. for those family pensions which began before 12th November 1979 and for those family pensions which began after 12th November 1979, the appropriate percentage provided for in sub paragraph (c) above.
- (f) 16.5 per cent. for ex-gratia payments to officers, RN ratings and RM other ranks invalided since 1st August 1969 as a direct result of terrorist activity in Northern Ireland.
- (g) 16.5 per cent. for ex-gratia payments to widows and children of those killed since 1st August 1969 as a direct result of terrorist activity in Northern Ireland.

6. The increase to be awarded to officers who served in certain salaried appointments for which provision is made in Orders in Council dated 13th December 1921 (No. 207°/CE), 26th May 1925 (No. 114A/CE) and 23rd July 1931 (No. 96/CE) and subsequent amending Orders in Council and whose retired pay includes an addition in respect of service in the salaried appointment, shall be, if they retired from the salaried appointment before 12th November 1979, as provided for in paragraph S(a). For those officers who retired from the salaried appointment on or after 12th November 1979 the increase to be awarded shall be the sum of:

- (a) the increases for which the service retired pay earned by service on the active list is eligible under this and previous Orders in Council according to the retired pay code under which this element of retired pay was awarded; and
- (b) the increase to the additional retired pay earned by service in the salaried appointment as provided for in sub-paragraph 5(c) of this Schedule according to the date this element of the retired pay began.

7. A pension specified in sub-paragraphs 1(d), (e), (f), (g) and (m) of this Schedule may be increased only by the extent to which a corresponding award under the Superannuation Acts 1965 and 1967 and/or the Principal Civil Service Pension Scheme 1974 as amended would have been increasable under the Pensions Increase (Review) Order 1979.

8. Any general condition attaching to the grant or continuance of a pension shall apply also to the grant or continuance of any increase to that pension.

At certain times during closures (a) to (f) above the following M1 Motorway slip roads will be closed:

IMPORTED FOOD REGULATIONS 1968, AS AMENDED

Official Certificate Procedure-Poultry Meat

IFR Circular 20/78 of 21st April 1978 set down the arrangements under which bulk packages of poultry car-cases from EC approved slaughterhouses could be imported for the purposes of cutting up in approved cutting premises in this country, without the need for the Official Certificate to be affixed to each individual carcase. EC Directive 80/879 extends this arrangement to

include:

- (a) large packages of poultry carcases consigned from approved slaughterhouses to approved cutting premises for cutting up;
- (b) large packages of poultry carcases, parts of carcases or certain offal (hearts, livers or gizzards) consigned from approved slaughterhouses or cutting premises to meat products establishments for treatment; or
- (c) large packages of poultry carcases consigned from approved slaughterhouses to restaurants, canteens, institutions and similar outlets for direct supply to the final user after heat treatment.

Under this arrangement such packages do not require marking of the individual contents provided the Official Certificate is affixed to the exterior of the package and the destination and intended use of the poultry meat is also clearly indicated on the outer package in the following manner:

> INTENDED USE: CUTTING/TREATMENT¹ Address of Destination:

> > (1) Delete as appropriate

The Official Certificate on the outer package must be in the form of the mark recognised for each exporting country by publication in the *London Gazette*: where two marks are recognised, the larger of the two should be used.

It is intended to incorporate these changes in a future amendment of the Imported Food Regulations. Mean-while, Port Health Authorities and local authorities concerned are asked to permit the entry, as from 1st January 1981, of any consignment of packages of poultry meat bearing the appropriate Official Certificate and an indica-tion of the destination and use in the form shown above.
