Notice is hereby given that the Oldham Borough Council, acting pursuant to arrangements made under section 101 of the Local Government Act 1972 with the Greater Manchester County Council propose to make an Order under sections 1 (1), (2) and (3) and 84D of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended, the effect of which will be to amend the Greater Manchester County (Various Roads, Oldham) Prohibition of Waiting of Goods Vehicles (Borough) Order 1980, by the prohibition of waiting of goods vehicles in any of the sides of lengths of roads or other areas specified in the Schedule to this Notice by the amendment of Article 2 of that Order to read as follows:

"Goods vehicles" means a motor vehicle constructed or adapted for use for the carriage of goods, or a trailer so constructed or adapted the unladen weight of which exceeds 30cwts.

And also to substitute the words Blackthorn Road for Lime Valley Road in the Schedule thereto.

Exemptions

(a) to enable persons to board or alight from a vehicle.
(b) to enable goods to be loaded onto or unloaded from a

(c) vehicles used for building or demolition operations, funerals, weddings, roadworks, works on sewers or statutory undertakers equipment.

(d) vehicles used in pursuance of statutory powers and duties.
Full details of the proposal are in the draft Order which, together with a map showing the lengths of roads referred to and a statement of the Council's reasons for proposing to make the Order, may be examined at my office between the hours of 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays.
