

3. The prohibition referred to in paragraph 2 above will not apply:

- (i) to bicycles (not being motor vehicles) which follow the route through the barrier indicated by traffic signs; or
- (ii) to vehicles being used for ambulance, fire brigade or police purposes in certain circumstances; or
- (iii) in respect of anything done with the permission or at the discretion of a police constable in uniform.

4. A copy of the Order (which contains a plan indicating the location of the barrier referred to in paragraph 2 above) and which will come into operation on 26th January 1981, can be inspected during normal office hours on Mondays to Fridays inclusive until the end of 6 weeks from the date on which the Order was made in Room B.21, The County Hall, London SE1 7PB.

5. Copies of the Order may be obtained from the Department of Transport and Development, Room 578, Main Building, The County Hall, London SE1 7PB.

6. Any person desiring to question the validity of the Order or of any provision contained therein on the ground that it is not within the powers of the relevant section of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967 or on the ground that any requirement of that section of the Act or of section 84A, 84B or 84C of the Act or of any regulations made under the said section 84C has not been complied with in relation to the Order may, within 6 weeks of the date on which the Order was made, make application for the purpose to the High Court.

*The Hackney (Restriction of Waiting on Bus Stops) (No. 2, 1978) (Amendment No. ) Traffic Order 198*

Notice is hereby given that the Greater London Council propose to make the above-mentioned Order under sections 6 and 84D of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by the Transport Act 1968 and the Road Traffic Act 1974.

2. The general effect of the Order would be further to amend the Hackney (Restriction of Waiting on Bus Stops) (No. 2) Traffic Order 1978, so as to prohibit all vehicles from waiting between 7 a.m. and 7 p.m. throughout the week on the area of carriageway lying within

or adjacent to the length of Amhurst Road specified in the Schedule to this notice and which area would be marked on the carriageway thereof by a yellow "Bus Stop" marking and by a single yellow line within that marking.

3. The prohibition would not apply:—

- (a) to vehicles being used under a road service licence whilst waiting at a place where it is authorised or required by that licence to pick up or set down passengers or to a vehicle being used to provide a London bus service, whilst picking up or setting down passengers; or
- (b) to a vehicle being used for ambulance, fire brigade or police purposes; or
- (c) in certain circumstances, to a vehicle being used in the service of a local authority, in connection with building operations, etc., adjacent to the bus stop or the removal of an obstruction to traffic or the repair etc. of the highway or of any service therein; or
- (d) to a vehicle waiting for not more than 2 minutes to enable a person to board or alight or to load or unload his personal baggage. The limit of 2 minutes would not apply if the person has serious difficulty in walking or is blind; or
- (e) where the person in control of the vehicle is required by law to stop or does so in order to avoid an accident; or
- (f) to anything done with the permission or at the discretion of a police constable in uniform.

4. A copy of the proposed Order, of the above-mentioned Order of 1978 (and of the Orders which have amended that Order) and of the Council's statement of reasons for proposing to make the Order can be inspected during normal office hours on Mondays to Fridays inclusive until the expiration of a period of 21 days from the date on which this Notice is published in Room B211 The County Hall, London SE1 7PB.

*The Kingston-upon-Thames (Prescribed Route) (No. 1) Traffic Order 1981*

Notice is hereby given that the Greater London Council on 16th January 1981 made the above-mentioned Order under section 6 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by the Transport Act 1968 and the Road Traffic Act 1974.

2. The effect of the Order will be to prohibit vehicles from entering that length of Wood Street which is shown cross-hatched on the plan comprising the Schedule to this notice:

- (a) between 8 p.m. and midnight and between midnight and 7 a.m. on Mondays to Saturdays inclusive, any

such day not being Christmas Day, Good Friday or a Bank Holiday;

- (b) at any time on Sundays, Christmas Day, Good Friday or a Bank Holiday.

(A barrier will be erected in this length of carriageway during these hours.)
