(b) to prohibit vehicular traffic entering:

(i) the carriageway on the south side of the island site at the junction of Greenford Road and Cowgate Road from Greenford Road;

(ii) Greenford Road from the forecourt of the garage and petrol filling station lying immediately south of the roundabout referred to in sub-paragraph (a) (i) above:

(iii) the unnamed road referred to in sub-paragraph (a) (ii) above from the forecourt of the pertol filling station lying between Middleton Avenue and the "Bridge Hotel" public house;

(iv) the gap in the central reservation which lies south-west of a point 18 metres south of the south-western kerb-line of Cowgate Road from the south-eastern carriageway of Greenford Road;

(c) to prohibit motor vehicles entering the service road at its north-eastern extremity:

This prohibition will not apply in relation to any motor vehicle requiring access to that road for the the purposes of exercising any statutory power or performing any statutory duty therein;
