Designation of Conservation Areas

Notice of the Designation of Two new Conservation Areas at Kettlebaston and Naughton

Kettlebaston

Notice is hereby given that Babergh District Council, in exercise of its powers under the above Act, has designated Kettlebaston as a Conservation Area. The boundary is as follows:

In the south-west the Conservation Area includes the cottage at Evans Corner and the hedgerow on the southern side of the Preston road. The boundary follows a ditch from the Preston road up through the farmyard to the moat of the Hall (including the older farm buildings at Kettlebaston Hall). The boundary then skirts the moat and the meadow adjoining the church, as far as Back Lane. The boundary then goes around the gardens of the houses at the northern end of the village, includes all the Church farmyard and, at a point 30 metres south of where the farmyard boundary meets the line of trees which runs from north to south, cuts across to skirt Stone Cottage and Auster Lodge, and back to the Preston road.

Naughton

Notice is hereby given that Babergh District Council, in exercise of its powers under the above Act, has designated Naughton as a Conservation Area. The boundary is as follows:

Starting at the Semer road, the Conservation Area boundary includes Fidget's Farm, the moat and the Old Manor. From the northern corner of the paddock at the Old Manor the boundary crosses the arable field towards the trees and includes the meadows which stand between the church and the thatched barn at Naughton Hall. The boundary then skirts the

moat of Naughton Hall, omits Hall Bungalow and runs along both sides of the road as far as The Wheelers' Arms, including the trees on both sides of the road and the wide ditch opposite the public house. The boundary follows the road to Nedging Tye, includes the farm buildings and the house at Cooper's Farm, crosses the Bricett road to include the old orchard, and the gardens of Pond Cottage and The Wheelers' Arms. The boundary then skirts the moat of Naughton Manor (including the trees on the outer bank) and joins New Road close to the manor gate. The boundary then follows the centre of New Road until it reaches the garden of Greenacre (which is not included) and then encloses the farmyard area and ponds adjacent to Ladies Cottage, as well as Ladies Cottage itself. The boundary then joins the Semer road again and goes down the middle of the road to the moat at Fidget's Farm.

The object of such designation is to preserve and enhance the character and appearance of areas of special architectural or historic interest.

The particular effects of such designation are that (subject to minor exceptions) no building, or part of a building, situated within a Conservation Area shall be demolished without Listed Building Consent from the Local Planning Authority, and no tree in a Conservation Area shall be cut down, lopped, topped, uprooted or wilfully damaged or destroyed without giving the Local Planning Authority 6 weeks prior notice of the intention.

Plans showing the areas concerned are available for public inspection between the hours of 9.30 a.m. and 4.30 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays at the Planning Department, 28-32 High Street, Hadleigh, Suffolk.
