(Restricted Road) Order 1980

- (3) Prohibit driving in:

George Yard, from its junction with Market Place in a westerly direction for a distance of 7.5 metres.

Market Place, from route A6 to the section of Market Place used for Market purposes, a distance of 13 metres.
