NOTICE OF CONFIRMATION OF PUBLIC PATH ORDER HIGHWAYS ACT 1959 COUNTRYSIDE ACT 1968

West Devon District Council Public Footpath Number 1 (Part) in the Parish of Whitchurch Public Path Diversion Order 1980.

Notice is hereby given that on 17th February 1981, the West Devon District Council confirmed the above Order.

The effect of the Order as confirmed is to divert that part of the Public Footpath Number 1 in the Parish of Whitchurch shown on the Definitive Map for Public Rights of Way in Devon commencing at the most northerly point of O.S. Plot No. 0533 (SX 4872) and proceeding in an irregular south-westerly direction across O.S. Plot No. 0533 and O.S. Plot No. 9831 (SX 4772) and in the vicinity of Hillside Cottage, Rixhill in the parish of Whitchurch for a distance of some 150 yards until it reaches the unclassified road running between Rixhill and Grenofen to a line commencing at the point being the most northerly point of O.S. Plot No. 0533 and proceeding in a south-south-westerly direction across O.S. Plot Nos. 0533 and 9831 until the unclassified road running from Rixhill to Grenofen is reached at a point about 70 yards south-east of the point where the above mentioned footpath reaches the unclassified road.

NOTICE OF PUBLIC PATH ORDER HIGHWAYS ACT 1959 COUNTRYSIDE ACT 1968

West Devon District Council Public Footpath Number 3(a) (Part) in the Parish of Whitchurch Public Path Diversion Order 1981.

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order made on 13th February 1981, is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation or to be confirmed as an unopposed Order by the West Devon District Council.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modifications, will be to divert that part of the Public Footpath Number 3(a) in the Parish of Whitchurch being shown on the Definitive Map for Public Rights of Way in Devon which commences at a point which lies in the north-eastern-most corner of O.S. Plot No. 2449 (SX 5072—Revised 1952) and proceeds firstly in an irregular north-north-easterly direction for a distance of approximately 91 metres across a track in O.S. Plot 4578 (SX 5072) and then to the south of the buildings known as Birchy Farm for a further distance of some 64 metres towards a point lying on the County Road running from Caseytown Cross to Higher Pennaton which point lies some 37 metres to the south of the entrance to Birchy Farmyard from that County Road to a line running commencing at the point lying in the north-easternmost corner of O.S. Plot 2449 and proceeding firstly in a southerly direction along the eastern boundary of that plot for a distance of some 240 metres and secondly in a south-easterly direction across that plot for some 220 metres to the easternmost tip of the said O.S. Plot 2449 which point is next to the road running from Caseytown Cross to Higher Pennaton some 667 metres to the south of Birchy Farm.

A copy of the Order and the map contained in it has been deposited and may be inspected free of charge at the District Council Offices, Kilworthy Park, Drake Road, Tavistock, between 9 a.m. and 12.45 p.m. and 1.45 p.m. and 4.30 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays.

If you wish to have sent to you in due course a notice to the effect that the Order has been confirmed, and a copy of the Order as confirmed, you should write to the Chief Executive and Secretary, West Devon District Council, Council Offices, Kilworthy Park, Drake Road, Tavistock, giving details of the name and address to which those documents may be sent.

Compensation for depreciation or damage in consequence of the coming into operation of the Order is payable in accordance with section 113 (2) of the Highways Act 1959, to which reference should be made.

Any representation or objection with respect to this Order may be sent in writing to the Chief Executive and Secretary, West Devon District Council, Council Offices, Kilworthy Park, Drake Road, Tavistock, before 13th July 1981, and should state the grounds upon which it is made.

If no representations or objections are duly made, or if any so made are withdrawn, the West Devon District Council may instead of submitting the Order to the Secretary of State for the Environment, themselves confirm the Order. If the Order is submitted to the Secretary of State, any representations or objections which have been duly made and not withdrawn will be transmitted with the Order.
