NOTICE OF PUBLIC PATH ORDER
HIGHWAYS ACT 1980
COUNTRYSIDE ACT 1968

The Durham County Council (Footpath No. 23 (Part), Parish of Hunstanworth) Public Path Diversion Order 1981.

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order, made on 10th April 1981, is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation, or to be confirmed by the Durham County Council, as an unopposed Order.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modifications, will be to divert part of public footpath No. 23 from a point outside No. 4 Boltsburn Terrace, Ramshaw in a south-westerly direction for a distance of 45 metres, then in a southerly direction for 30 metres and then in a north-easterly direction for a distance of 10 metres to rejoin its existing route.

If no representations or objections are duly made or if any so made are withdrawn the Durham County Council may, instead of submitting the Order to the Secretary of State, themselves confirm the Order. If the Order is submitted to the Secretary of State, any representations or objections which have been duly made and not withdrawn will be transmitted with the Order.

If you wish to have sent to you in due course a notice to the effect that the Order has been confirmed, you should write to the Chief Executive and Clerk, Durham County Council, County Hall, Durham, giving your name and address to which those documents may be sent.

The Hampshire (Test Valley Borough No. 7) (Parish of Kings Somborne—Part of Footpath No. 1 and Parish of Bossington Part of Footpath No. 5) Public Path Diversion Order 1980.

Notice is hereby given that on 25th March 1981 the Hampshire County Council confirmed the above-named Order.

The effect of the Order as confirmed is to divert the public rights of way in the Parishes of Kings Somborne and Bossington described in the First part of the Schedule hereto to the route described in the Second part.

Copies of the confirmed Order and the map contained in it have been deposited at the office of the secretary and Solicitor, Test Valley Borough Council, Beech Hurst, Weyhill Road, Andover, at Kings Somborne Post Office, Kings Somborne and at the office of the undersigned, where they may be inspected free of charge during normal office hours.

The Order becomes operative as from 22nd April 1981, but if any person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the Highways Act 1980, or on the grounds that any requirement of the Act, or any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the confirmation of the Order, he may, under paragraph 2 of Schedule 2 to the Act as applied by paragraph 5 of Schedule 6 to the Act, within 6 weeks from 10th April 1981, make application for the purpose to the High Court.

SCHEDULE

PART I

Descriptions of Sites of Existing Paths

Those parts of the Footpaths in the Parishes of Kings Somborne and Bossington in the Borough of Test Valley shown on the Definitive Map of Public Rights of Way prepared under Part IV of the National Parks and Access to the Countryside Act 1949, as described below:

(a) Bossington Footpath No. 5

That part of the footpath which commences at a junction with Kings Somborne Footpath No. 1 and runs south-westwards for approximately 24 metres then west-south-westwards for approximately 72 metres then south-westwards for approximately 32 metres then west-south-westwards for approximately 36 metres. A total distance of approximately 164 metres.

(b) Kings Somborne Footpath No. 1

That part of the footpath which commences at the eastern end of the path described in Part 1 (a) of this Schedule and runs east-north-eastwards for approximately 84 metres then north-eastwards for approximately 84 metres then generally east-south-eastwards for approximately 190 metres. A total distance of approximately 358 metres.

PART II

*Descriptions of Sites Alternative Highways**(a) Bossington Footpath No. 5*

A 1.8 metre wide enclosed grass path which commences at the western end of the path described in Part I (a) of this Schedule and runs east-north-eastwards for approximately 160 metres to a bridge at the Parish boundary.

(b) Kings Somborne Footpath No. 1

A 1.8 metre wide enclosed grass path which commences at the eastern end of the path described in Part II (a) of this Schedule and runs east-north-eastwards for approximately 353 metres.

The County of Hereford and Worcester (Footpath No. 19 Allensmore) Public Path Extinguishment Order 1981

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order made on 2nd April 1981 is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation, or to be confirmed, as an unopposed Order, by the County Council of Hereford and Worcester.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modifications, will be to extinguish that length of footpath No. AN19 in the Parish of Allensmore situate over the land off the UC838 Madley to Allensmore road commencing at a point situate a distance of approximately 36 metres (40 yards) south of the right angled junction of footpath No. KS30 in the Parish of Kingstone and proceeding in a north-easterly direction for a distance of approximately 15 metres (20 yards) to the gate of Oris Nursery, thence proceeding in an easterly direction for approximately 86 metres (93 yards) past the Nursery House (The Oris) through the Nursery beds to a point where it strikes the cross hedge and proceeds in a north-easterly direction for approximately 96 metres (104 yards) to a low climbable iron fence in the hedge and continuing in the same direction for approximately 156 metres (170 yards) to a point, being a metal gate in the hedge bounding the UC 838 Madley to Allensmore road. The total length of the existing path is approximately 356 metres (387 yards).
