Hulls July 3.

His week arrived here one fhip of this place called the Supply, from Virginia, laden with Tobacco, three fhips of this place from Holland laden with the feveral Commodities of that place, one from Hambourg, one Swede from Stockholm laden with Iron; two Norway fhips with Deals, and two fhips from the Eaff Countrey, laden with Flax and Henp.

Lyme, July 9. This week arrived here the Francis of this place from Morlaix, and the Windfor and Elizabeth from St Malos with the utual lading from those parts; thele inform us, that a little before they came from thence, five hundred S amen were fent from St Maloes, and half the number from Morlaix, to be Embarked upon the French Kings faips at Breft, 14 Sayl of men of war being there fitting up, and to be fpeedily manned; but tis not yet faid upon what Expedition. New 4000 men are now employed at Breft about their fhips and Magazins.

Rome, June 21. The Pope is fiill confulting how to leffen the publick expence, and unwilling to prefs the people with any new Taxes, however it was rumored to the contrary, but endeavouring rather to eafe them from those already imposed, and particularly, from the Tax upon Meal, which most fensibly afflicts the poorest fort of people. The Reformation of the foldiery is well advanced, and like to be a great eafe to the publick, and may fave the Chamber neer 70 thousand Crowns a year.

The Pope has according to the cultome of his Predecellors, granted an universal Jubile upon his Exaltation, and has on foot began his Devotions to feveral Churches upon that account.

On Tuesday last towards the Evening, dyed here Segnior Baily Camillo Rospiglos, a person much lamented by the Poor, who had received several demonstrations of his great Charity; the Cardinal his fon, with several others of his Fam ly, were prefent at his death, and have fince caused a solemn Funeral Service to be performed for him in the Jefuits Church: the said Cardinal is purchasing the Lands of Zagurola, for Gio. Battista Rospiglios his Brother, and Heir to the deceased Camillo, who is to be declared a Duke, in which Purchase the Pope is pleased to be an affistant, leaving several places in the Mounts of Piety to his disposal:

Cardinal Raggi is going for Genoua his own Country, having obtained leave from the Pope, to refign an Atby in his posseful to his Nephew Ferdinand. On Sunday last Cardinal Bichi went hence towards Osfimo, and to morrow Cardinal Refecti goes hence for Factta; and Cardinal Caraccioli, and the Marquis de Pefcara for Naples, from whence they write that the Viceroy has well fortified all his Sea Coasts, to prevent any defign the Turks might have to land, and had font out two Felucas for intelligence to obferve the motion of the Turkith Fleet, of whose defigns he had fome happrehenfions. The Duke d' Albukerque has taken alfo the fame, care for the Defence of Sicilr, and daily expects the arriv. 1 of his fueceflor the Prince de Ligne. Venice, July 5. Letters from Cavalier Moline from Suda inform us, that the Visier put to Sea the 20th of May with a great Fleet of Galleys and other ships, and several Tripolines, intending to wait on the Grand Segnior at Adrianople: Cavalier Molino our Ambassador is gone with him, attended by a Train of 70 perfons, which are to be Entertained during their Voyage upon the Visiers expense.

The Visier before his departure had Visited all the principal places of the Kingdom of Candia, Ordering firong Forts to be built at Chironis and Letrino, and for an additional firength to the Town of Candia, had caused a line to be drawn from the Fort St Andre towards the Scassified, with a kind of Fort upon it, whereon are placed Cannons which will not only fecure the Port on that fide, but will render the Fort St Andre much firenger then before.

He has by a fevere Proclamation, Commanded that no Chriftian shall be fuffred to lodge at night in *Cinea*, permitting them only Trade by day. He has Ordered all the Houfes in *Candia*, to be fold at reafonable prizes to the Turks, and caufed all the Churches to be pulled down or turned into *Mofques* for the exercise of the Turksth Religion, except only two little ones, one of them having been purchafed with fome few houfes in the Country by a Grecian Bishop, for the fum of 2500 Reals, and the other by fome Monks of the Order of Mount *Sinai* who are also *Grecians*, fo that the Exercise of Christian Religion is every where suppressed of a Church, but the people Ordered to shave and Cloath themselves after the Turkish fashion.

The Visier has taken to great a love to *Candia* that nothing but the importunity and Sommands of the *Sultan* could have obliged him to leave it, during his stay he had taken care to adorne the City of *Candia*, and has during his absence intrusted that carey with his Commissioners, but they every where break down the Statues as not permitted by their Religion.

From Dalmatia they write that the Grand Segnior had fent fome perfons to Conftantinople to caufe his Brother to be put to Death, according to the fevere Policy of that Empire, but the Janifaries had protected him, and killed the Emperors Meffengers, which has fo much incenfed him, that he refolves to march thither with his whole army to take revenge of the front.

The Proveditor General Barbaro is going to Vifit Gattaro, to dispose of 800 Souldiers for the reinforcement of several Garrisons, and to take Order for the furnishing the Lagaretti, for the Reception of Merchants goods coming from the Lewant, towards which work the Senate have sent him the sum of 20 thousand Ducats.

The Senate has refolved upon the Election of a Proveditor for the Government of the Territory of *Cliffa* and fome other places, which were conquered during the late wars with the Turk, to whom fuch inftructions are to be given as may render those places of advantage to the Publick.
