Florence, June 2. N. S. The Grand Duke and all the Court are gone into Mourning, on account of the Death of the late Emperor. The Hereditary Prince of Tuscany's Dislemper is so far abated, that we begin to entertain some hopes of his Recovery. We have received Advices from Bologna, importing, that some Contentts between the Dukes of Parma and Modena, on account of a Fief at the Mouth of the River Lenza, to which both have laid their Claims; have produced Acts of Hostility between them, and the Militia on both sides have come to an Engagement, in which about six hundred Men were killed. It is said, the Modenese were the Aggressors, and worsted the opposite Party, but that the Duke of Parma has thereupon declar'd open War against his Competitor.

Milan, June 2. N. S. The Marquis de Moles is arriv'd here from Barcelona; from whence they write, that the News of the late Accommodation with the Malecontents was received there with extream Satisfaction; and that since the Death of the Emperor, the Catalans have given his Catholick Majesty fresh Assurances of their Zeal and Fidelity. The Dutchess of Anjou's Departure for Corella is fix'd for the 7th Instant, and the Court at Saragossa hope the Change of Air will contribute to the Recovery of that Princess's Health. The Duke of Anjou proposeth to accompany her thither, and then to put himself at the Head of his Army, which is to March soon after towards Barcelona, in order to open the Campaign. Twenty four Pieces of Cannon have been lately conducted to Tortosa, where they are laying up Stores of Ammunition and Provisions, and continue to give out, that their Intentions are to lay Siege to Parragona; but it is still thought they will be in
